

SAT Participation for Juniors in NYC


In March 2016, New York City piloted a free SAT administration during the school day for juniors in 91 schools and in March 2017 the SAT was made available free of charge to all juniors.

The percent of juniors who took the SAT at least once in three years of high school









NYC SAT Participation for Seniors by Ethnicity









