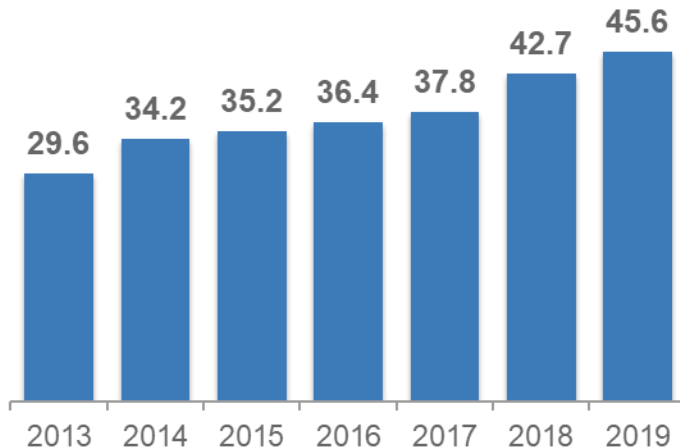
Proficiency Rates for NYC Students in Math & English

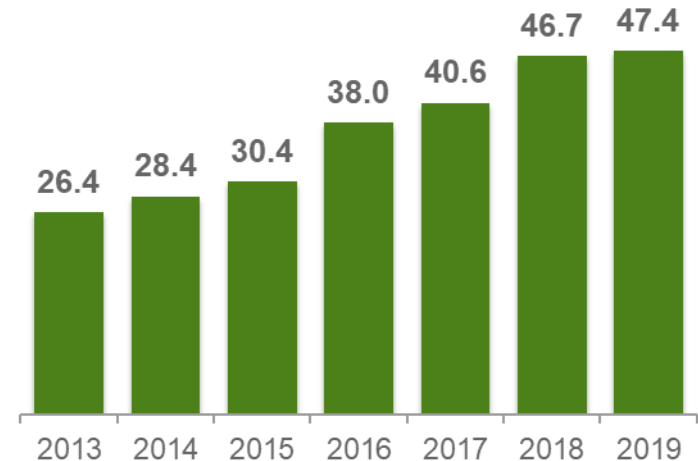

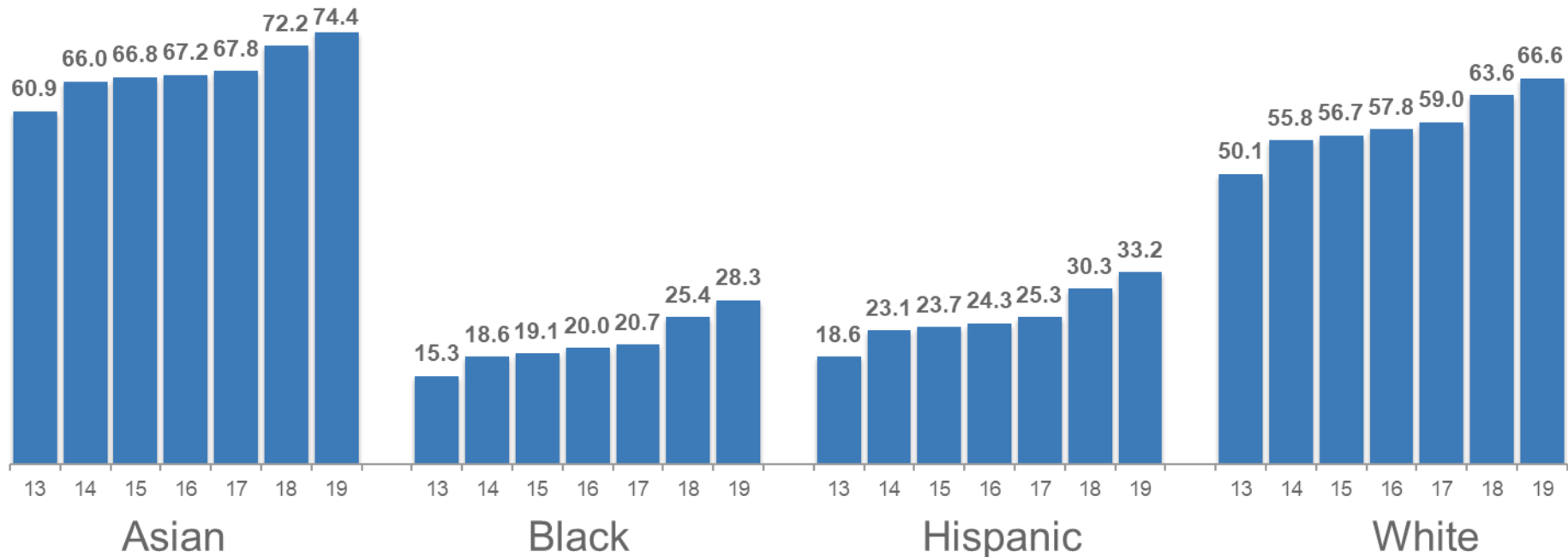

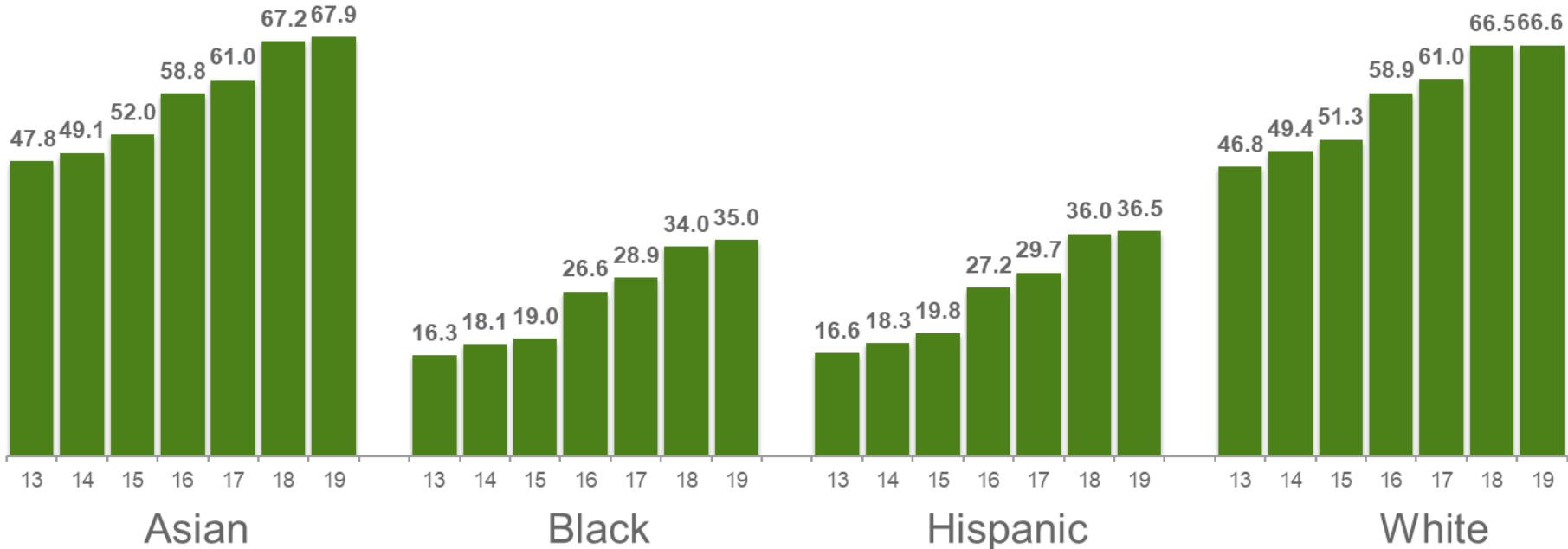

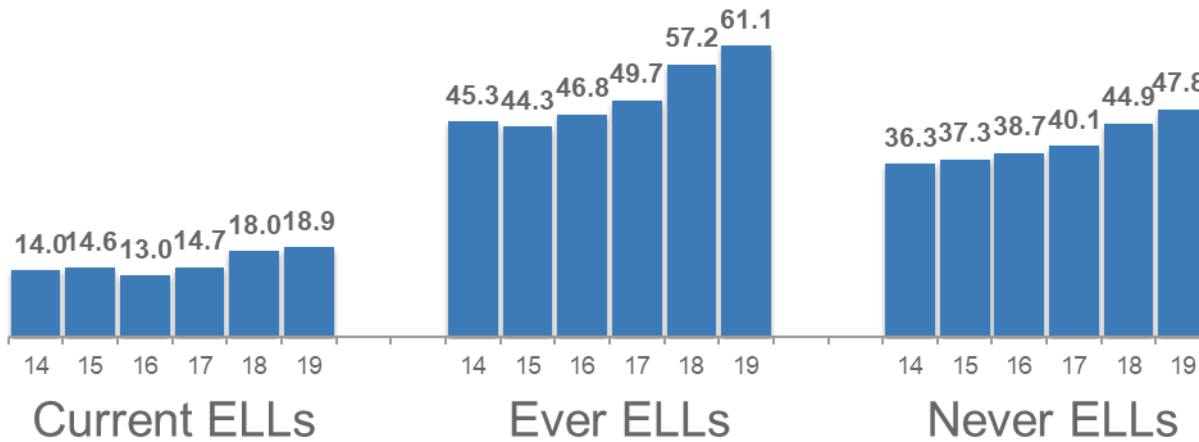

Proficiency Rates for NYC Multilingual Learners

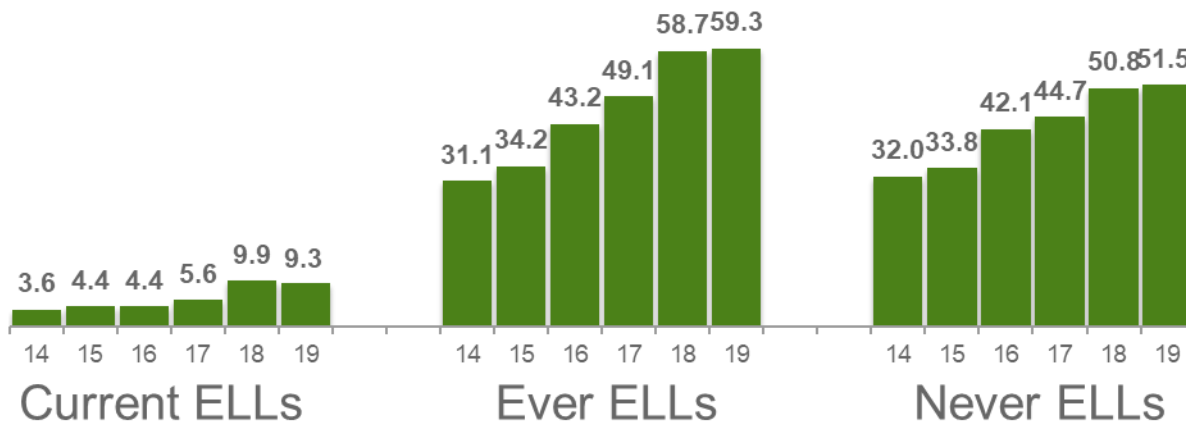

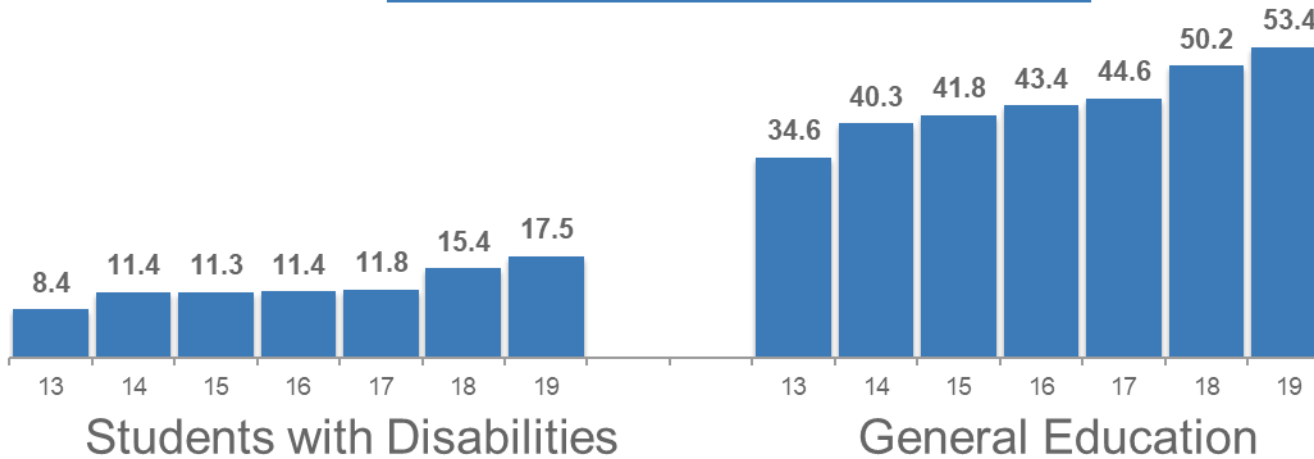

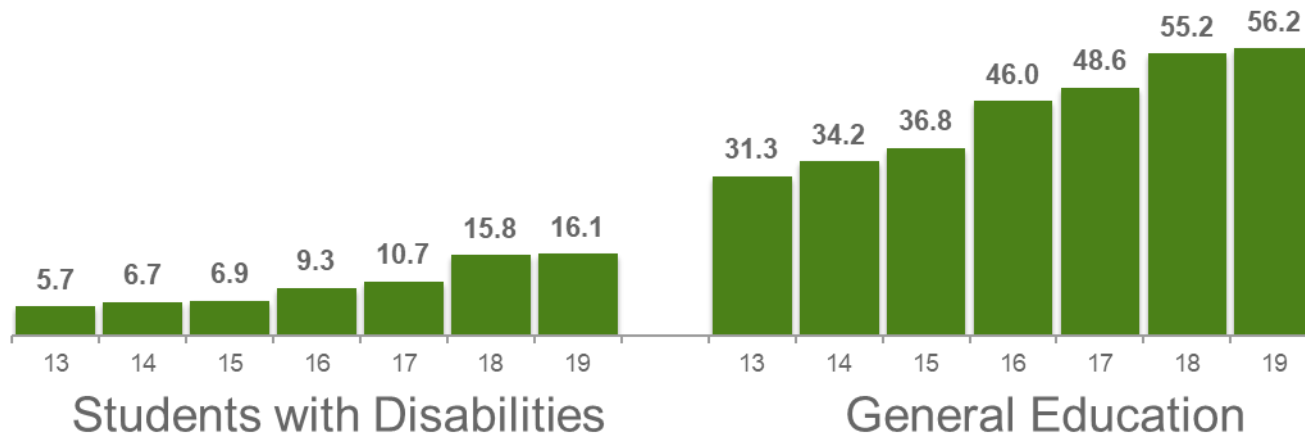

Notes

- In 2018, the NYSED rescaled the Math and ELA exams to account for a change in test administration from 3 days to 2 days. Therefore, 2018 & 2019 results cannot be compared to prior years.
- A change in State testing policy drove a decrease in 8th grade math proficiency rates since 2014: to reduce double testing, most students in accelerated math courses who took the Algebra Regents exam were exempted from taking the 8th grade State math assessment. In 2019, 25,657 8th graders took the Algebra Regents and 81.4% passed with a 65 or higher.
- For slides disaggregating data by race/ethnicity group, small groups, including Native American and Multi-Racial, are not shown.
- For slides disaggregating data by multilingual learner status, current English Language Learners are English Language Learners during the testing year. Ever English Language Learners are students identified as English Language Learners any year prior to the testing year, but not including the testing year. Never English Language Learners are students who were never identified as an English Language Learner. Data for Ever and Never English Language Learners are only available from 2014 and later.
- All point changes are based on unrounded numbers.
