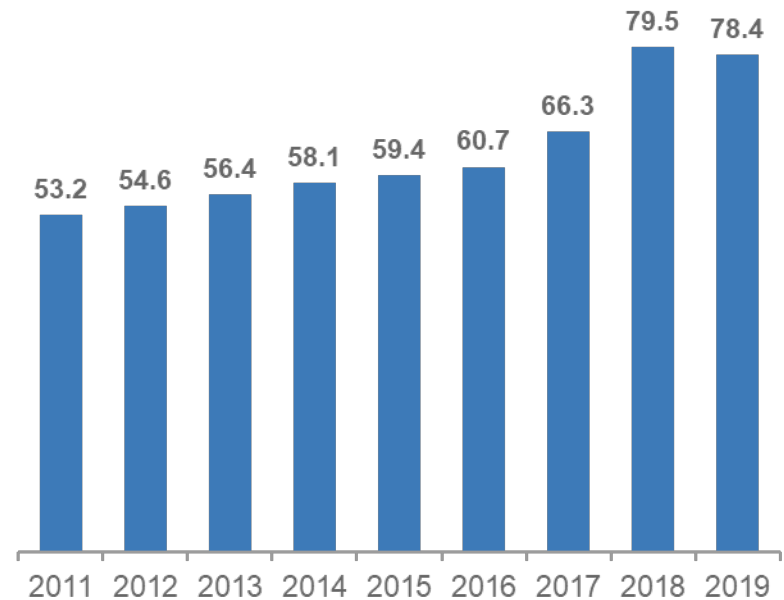
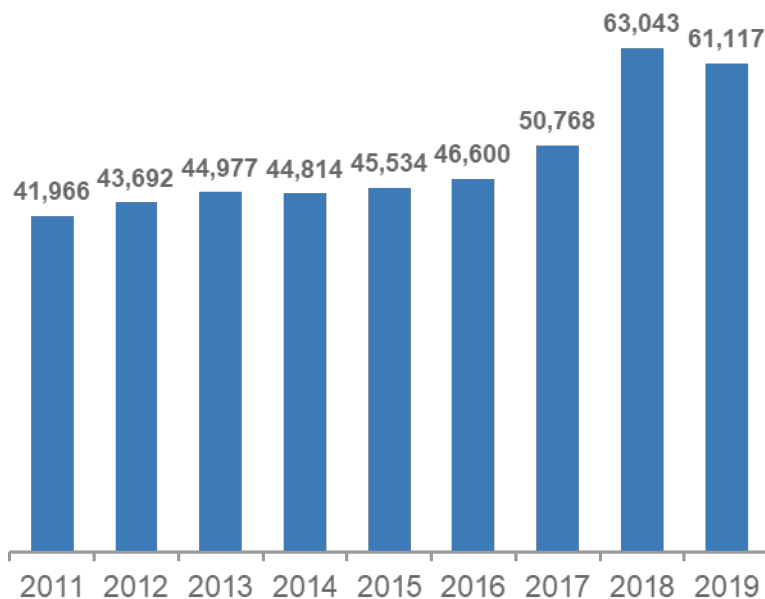
The number and percent of the ninth grade cohort who took the SAT at least once in four years of high school

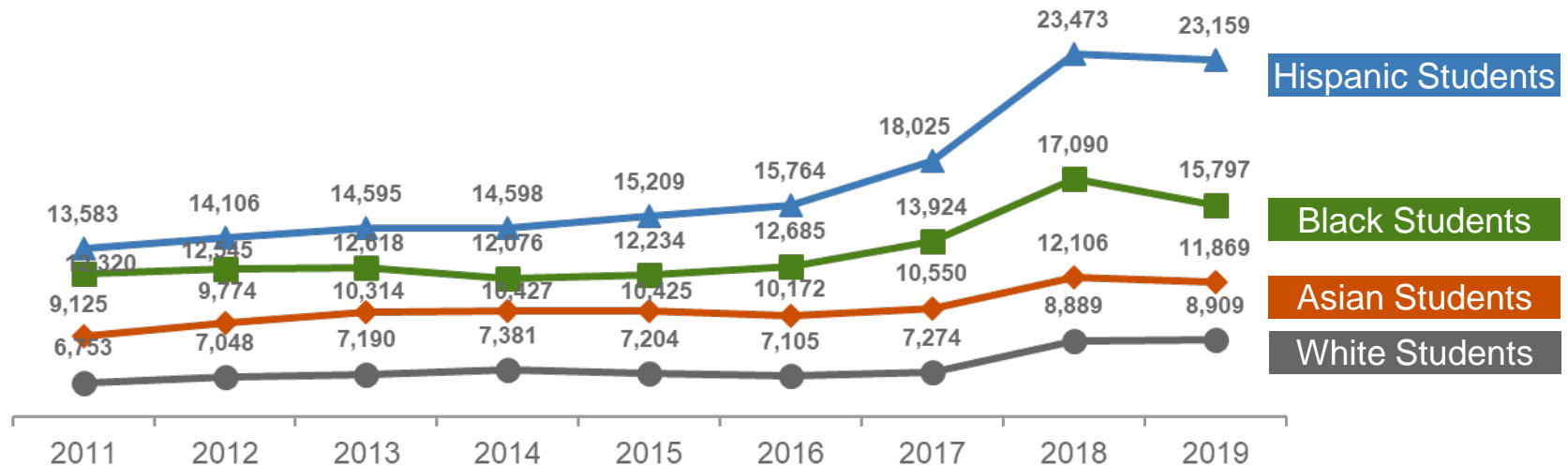

The number of students in the ninth grade cohort who took the SAT at least once in four years of high school

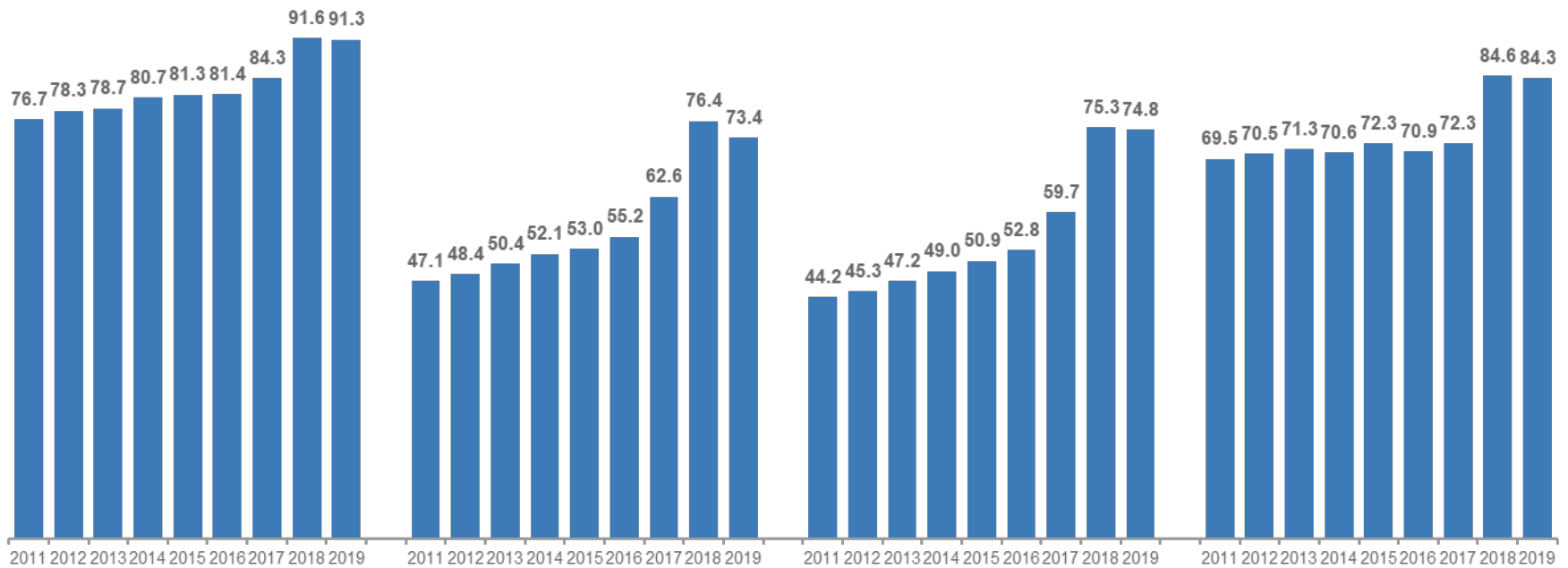

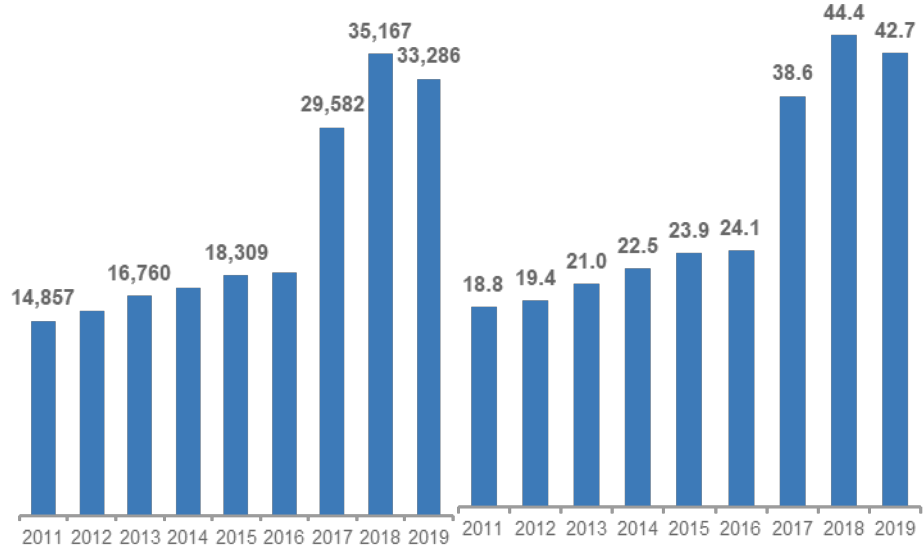
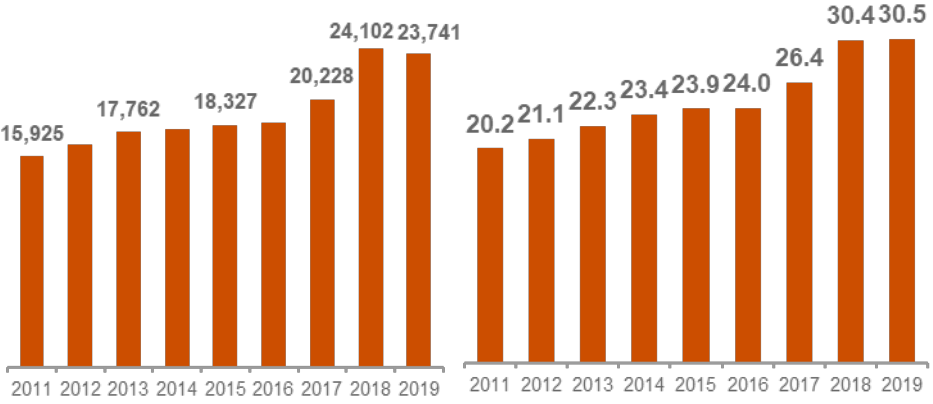
Number and percent of students meeting college ready cut scores on the SAT after four years of high school

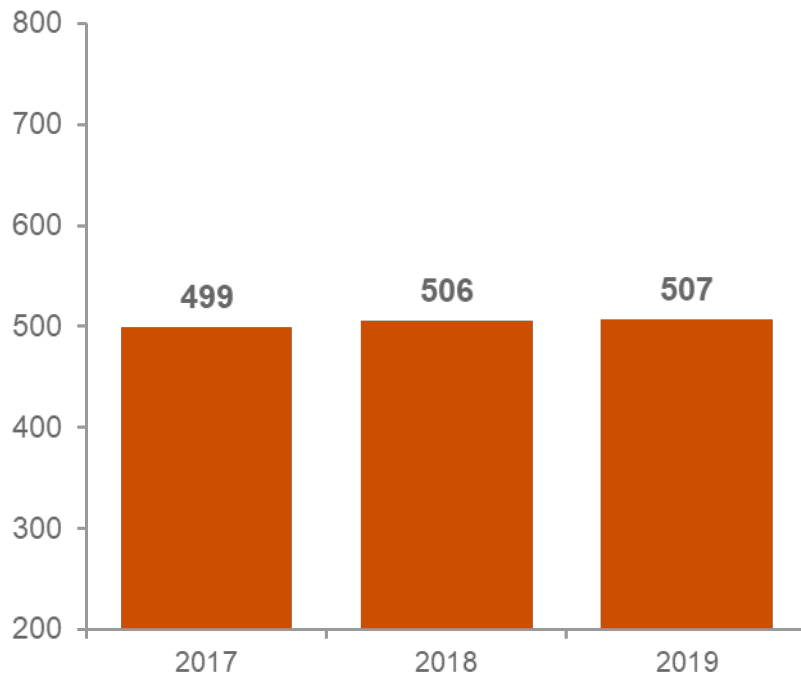

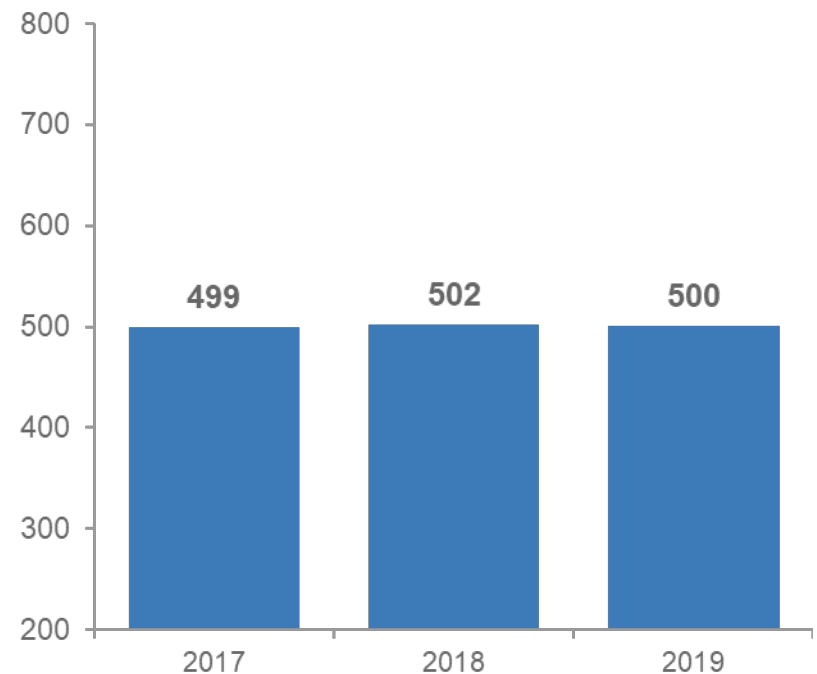
NYC SAT Performance by Subject for Seniors

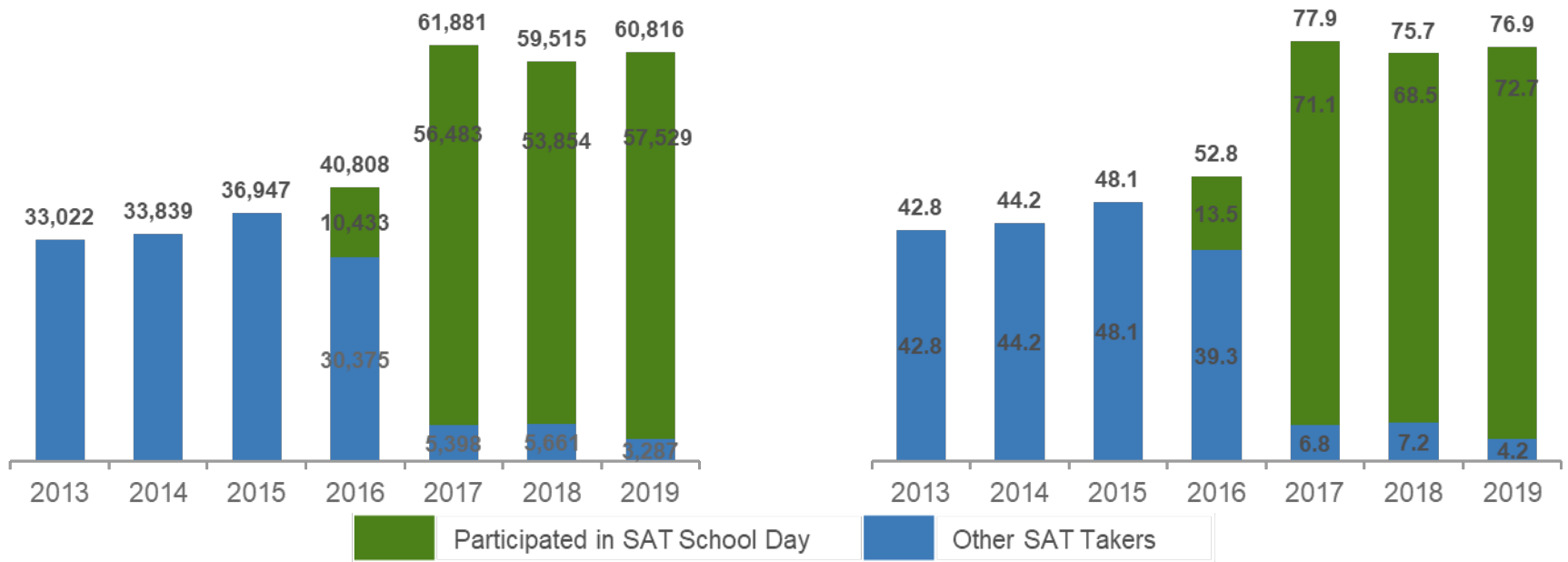

- Students who are not matched are not included.
- Some charter school data are not available for 2018 or later.
- Point changes are based on unrounded numbers.
- Seniors are defined as students in their fourth year of high school; Juniors are defined as students in their third year of high school.

Slide 5: NYC Seniors Meeting College Ready Cut Scores

- Scores reflect the citywide averages of students' highest score through their fourth year of high school.
- Students can place out of reading remediation at CUNY with a 480 critical reading score on the “old” SAT or 480 evidence-based reading & writing on the “new” SAT and place out of math remediation with a 500 score on the “old” SAT or a 530 score on the “new” SAT.

Slide 7: SAT Scores by Subject for Seniors for NYC, the Nation and the Rest of New York State (ROS)

- National and state results are from the College Board's NYC District Integrated Summary report; scores only available for seniors.
- Average scores displayed for New York City reflect seniors' *latest* scores in four year of high school rather than their *highest* score in order to mirror the College Board's methodology for the national and state scores.

Slide 8: SAT School Day Participation for Juniors in NYC

- In March 2016, New York City piloted a free SAT administration during the school day for juniors in 91 schools and in March 2017 the SAT was made available free of charge to all juniors.
