

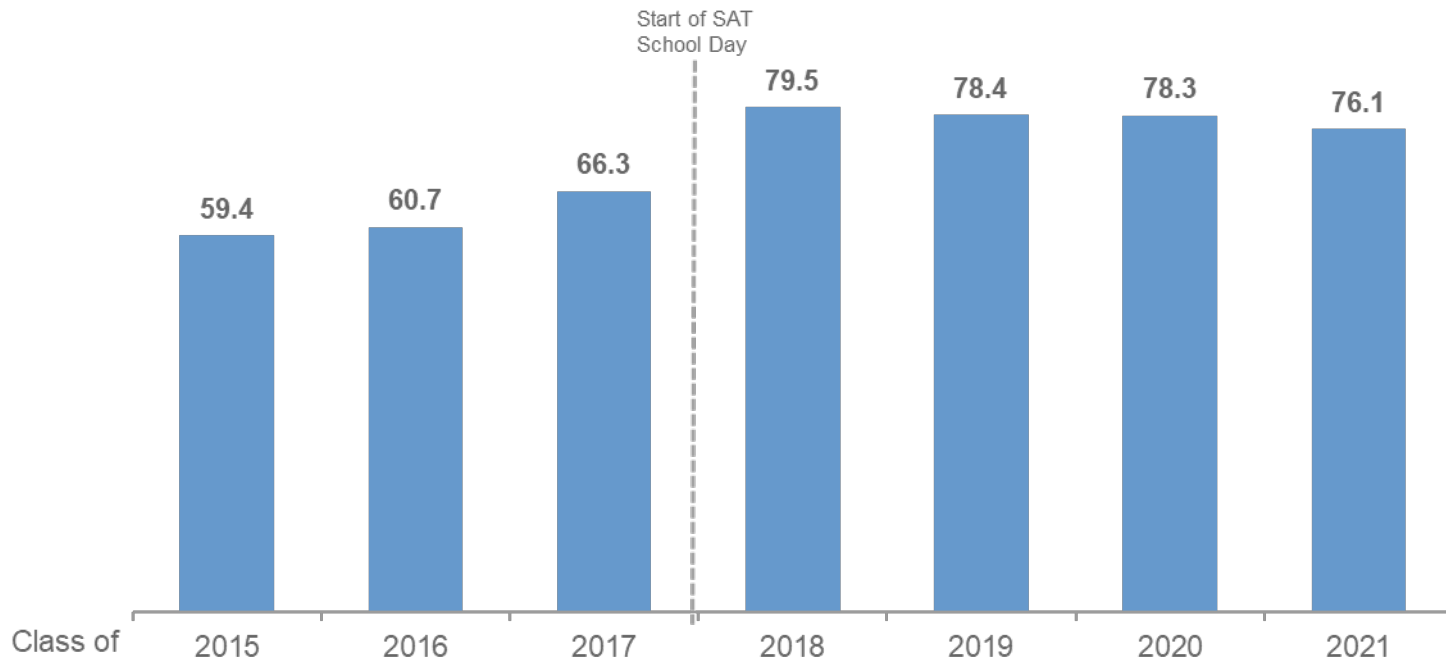

The percent of the ninth grade cohort who took the SAT at least once in four years of high school

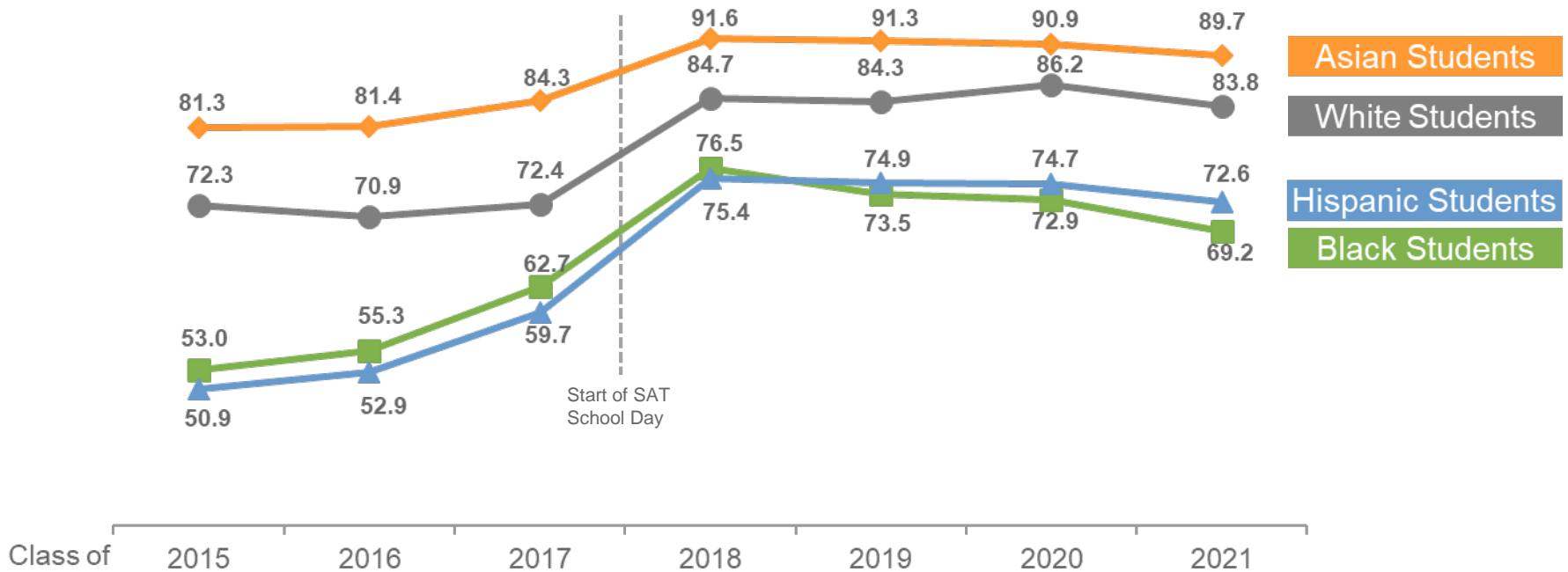

College Ready Cut Scores on SAT

Among other criteria, students can place out of reading remediation at CUNY with a 480 critical reading score on the “old” SAT or 480 evidence-based reading & writing on the “new” SAT and place out of math remediation with a 500 score on the “old” SAT or a 530 score on the “new” SAT.

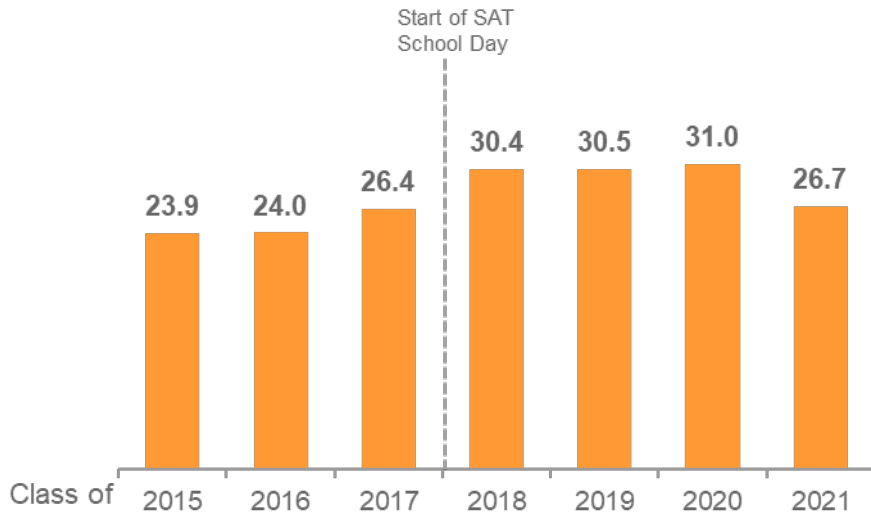
Number and percent of students meeting college ready cut scores on the SAT after four years of high school

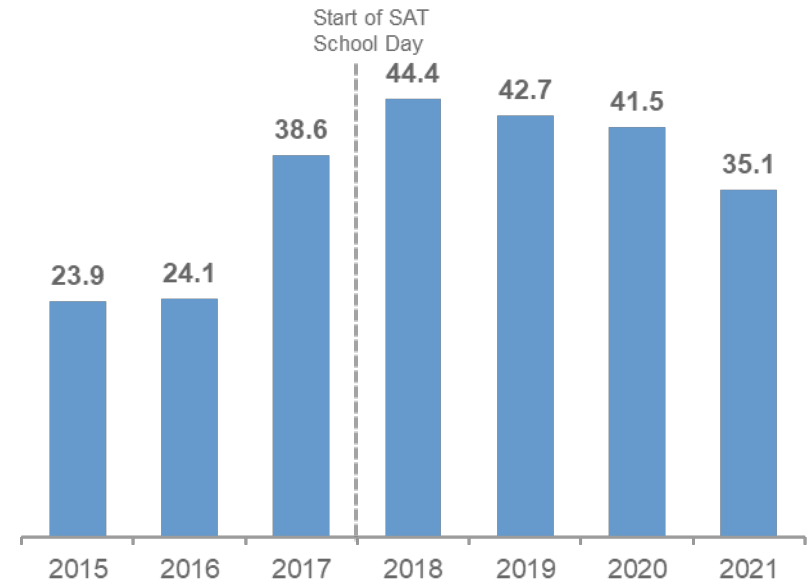


Critical Reading or Evidence-Based Reading & Writing

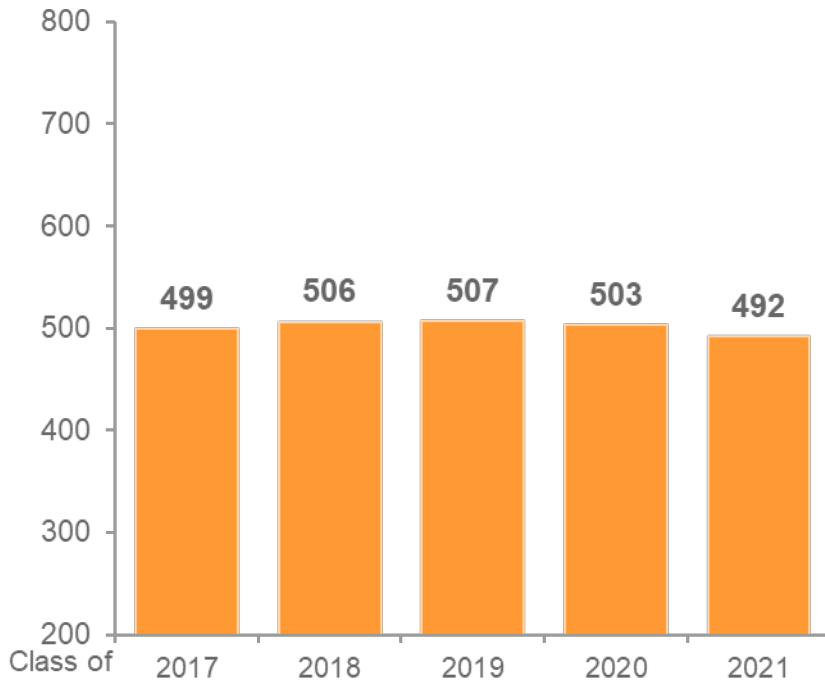

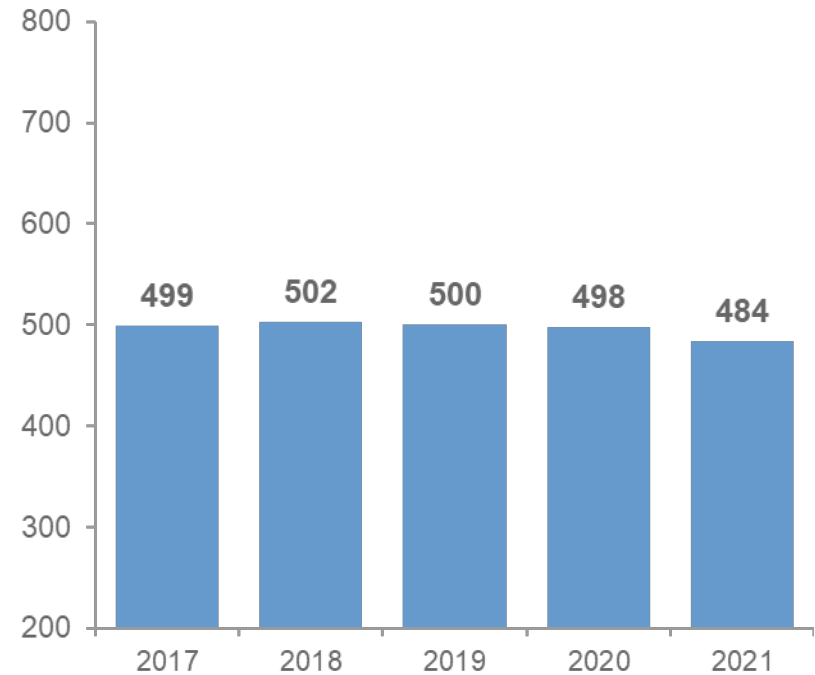
SAT Performance by Subject

Note that due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the shift to remote learning, only 10 percent of students from the class of 2021 sat for the SAT exam two or more times to attempt a higher score, compared to 42 percent of students from the class of 2020.

Evidence-Based Reading & Writing

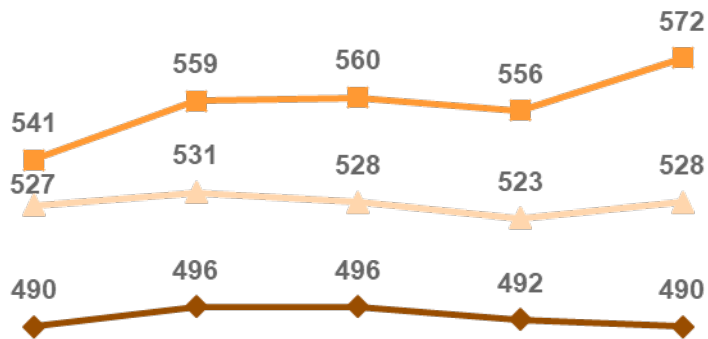


Note: Average scores prior to 2017 cannot be compared over time due to the test change in March 2016.

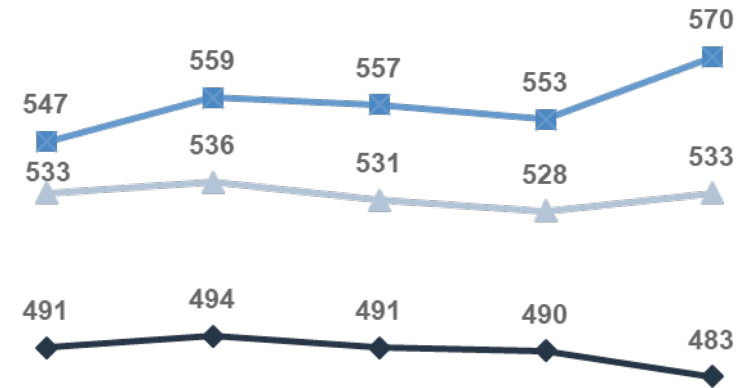
SAT Scores by Subject: NYC, the Rest of New York State and the Nation

Note that while the number of students in the NYC class of 2021 sitting for the SAT exam decreased by 4 percent, there was a 41 percent decrease in participation for the rest of New York State and a 31 percent decrease nationally.

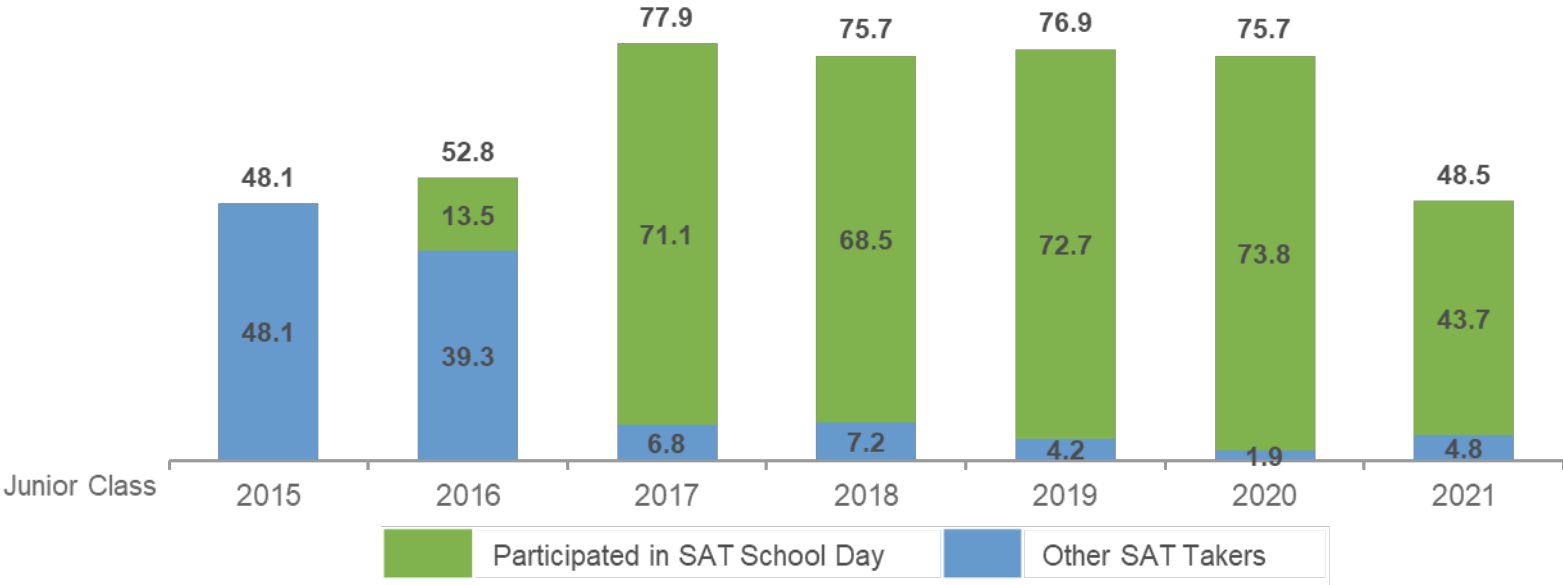

SAT School Day Participation through Junior Year

In March 2016, New York City piloted a free SAT administration during the school day for juniors in 91 schools and in March 2017 the SAT was made available free of charge to all juniors.
