

New York City Public Schools Discharge Reporting – 2022-23 School Year

Background

Local Law 42, enacted in 2011, requires New York City Public Schools (NYCPS) to report to the New York City Council by June 30, 2024 the number of students in grades 6 through 12 who were discharged, transferred, or graduated during the 2022-23 school year. This document summarizes the reported data.

This law requires the reporting of discharges and graduations that occur during one school year. NYCPS ordinarily presents both types of events in the context of a 9th grade graduation cohort, reflecting discharges that occurred at any time during the cohort's four years of high school. Graduations and discharges are ordinarily reported by cohort because it allows NYCPS to measure how well schools are preparing students to earn a high school diploma.

The data required by Local Law 42 reflects a snapshot of all students enrolled in a particular school year, regardless of their cohort. The data included in this reporting therefore differs significantly from other graduation and discharge results reported by NYCPS. As a snapshot of students at different stages of their educational careers, data reported by school year is less meaningful than cohort reporting as a measure of schools' success in keeping students engaged and moving them to graduation.

Official, Publically Reported Graduation and Dropout Rates (for context & not included in this report)

Graduation, Dropout Rates and Discharges Outside of NYC: The New York State Education Department and NYCPS [reported](#) outcomes for the cohort of students who entered 9th grade in 2019 and completed their fourth year of high school in 2023. According to these data:

- 83.7% of the class of 2023 graduated within four years by August flat, flat from 83.7% in 2022.
- 5.4% of the class of 2023 dropped out, flat from 5.4% in 2022.
- A high school student with a confirmed discharge to a public or private school outside of the New York City school district is removed from a school's graduation cohort. According to these data, the number of students discharged outside of New York City was 9,436 for the class of 2023, compared to 9,042 for the class of 2022. Note that these cohorts were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Discharge Reporting Results for the 2021-22 School Year

In contrast to the cohort reporting described above, the data required by Local Law 42 includes all students enrolled in grades 6 through 12 during the 2022-23 school year, and only includes discharge and transfer events that occurred between the audited register date (10/31) and the end of the school year.

- 3.2% of students (15,527 of the 484,688 students enrolled in district schools) transferred between New York City public schools, including charter schools, compared to 2.8%.
- 2.0% of students (9,669 of 484,688) were discharged outside of New York City public schools, compared to 2.1% in 2021-22.
- 0.8% of students (3,655 of 484,688) dropped out or were discharged under other codes, compared to 0.8% in 2021-22.

Methodology

At the citywide, borough and district levels, NYCPS is required to report discharge, transfer and graduation counts by grade level (middle school only), cohort (high school only) and disability status. At the school level, the DOE is required to report discharge and transfer counts by grade level (middle school only), cohort (high school only), disability status broken down by, age as of 12/31 of the previous calendar year age, race/ethnicity, and gender.

The report contains data for districts 1-32, 75 and 79. For the purpose of the report, the analysis includes the last transaction for each student from the audited register date when official enrollment is established (10/31/21) to the end of the school year. Annual matriculation discharges, i.e. the ones when students are moving from Grade 8 to high school, are not included in the report.
