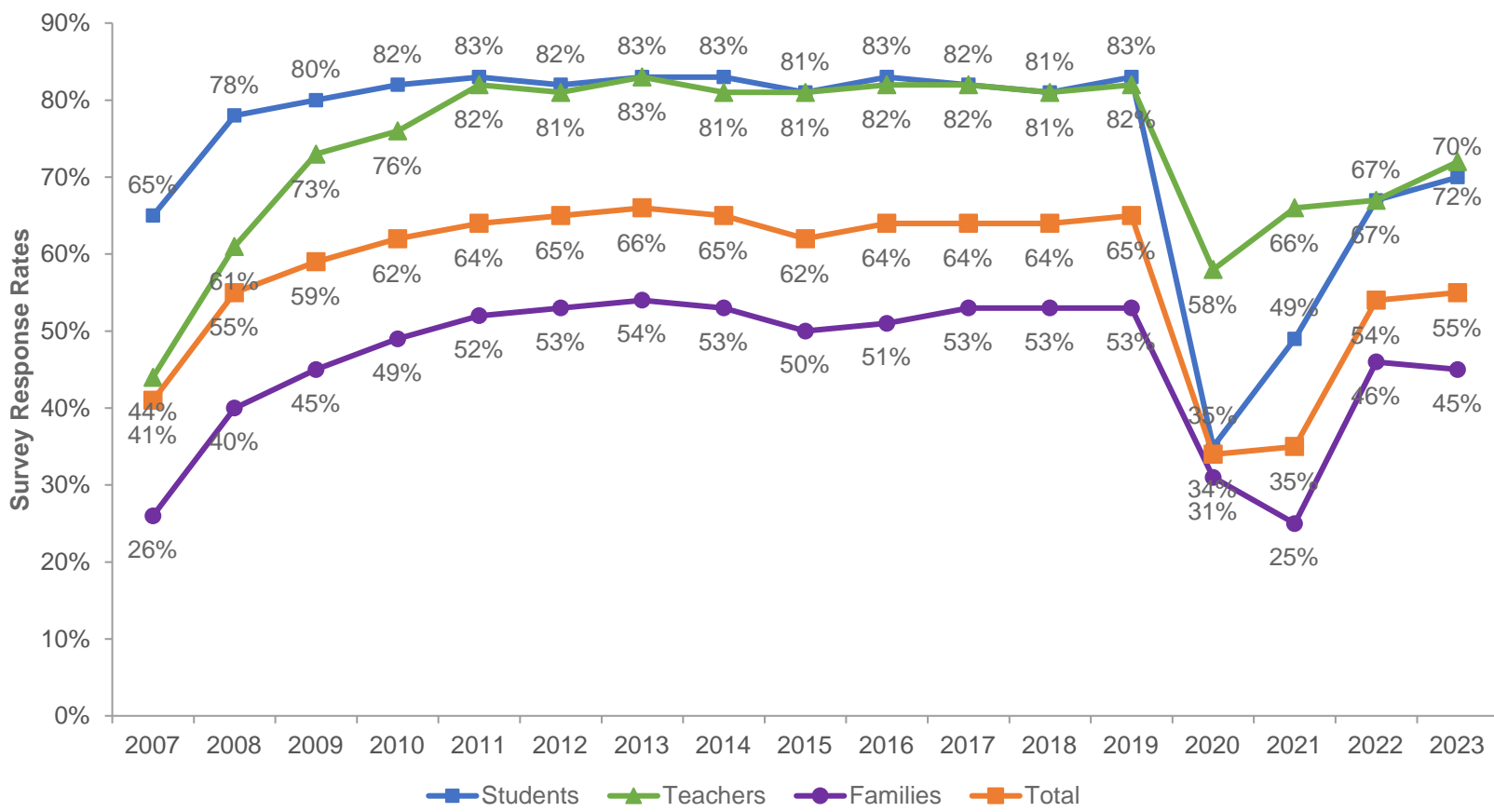


# NYC School Survey Citywide Results

# 2023 NYC School Survey response rates were lower than in pre-pandemic years, but more students and teachers took the survey than last year.



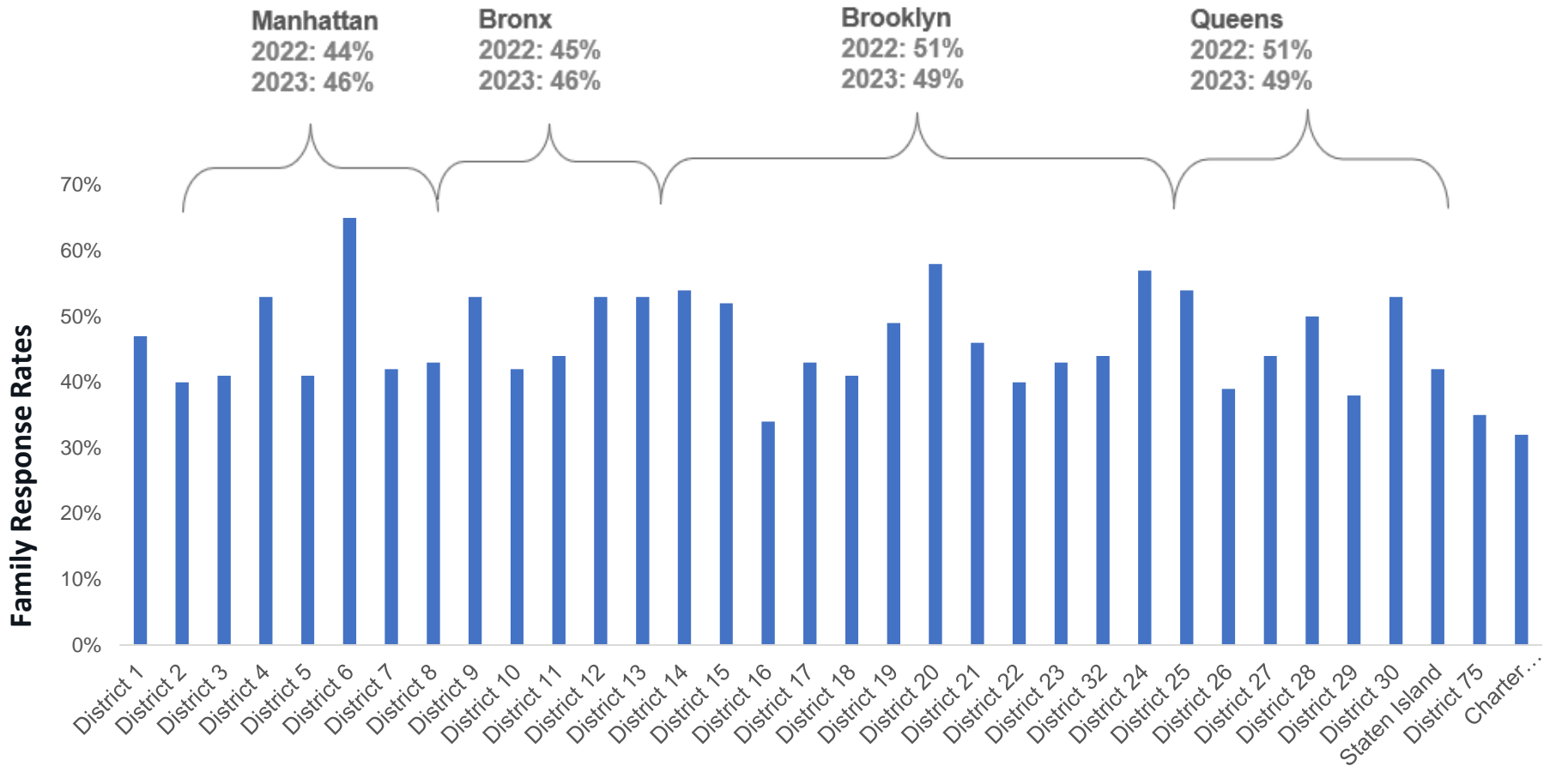

# 2023 Family Survey Participation Citywide

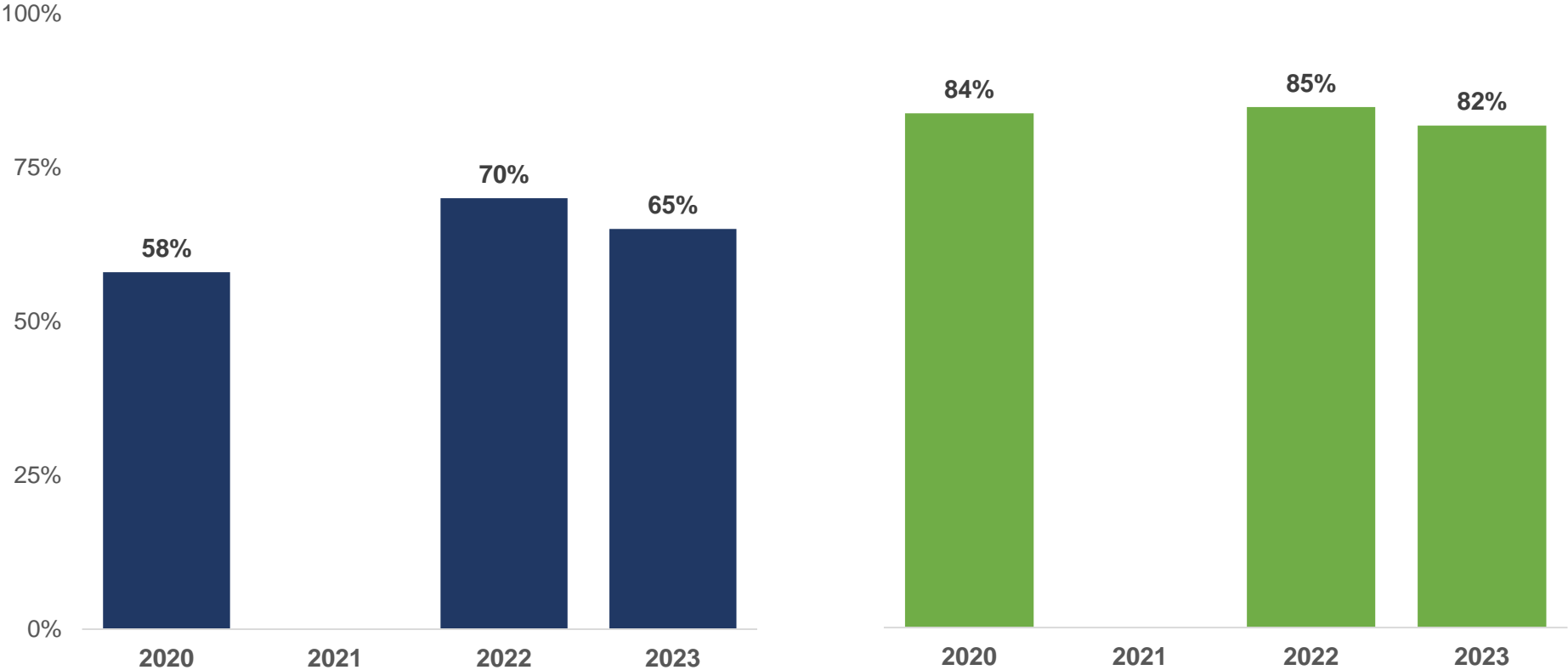

I feel safe in the hallways, bathrooms, locker rooms, and cafeteria of my school.



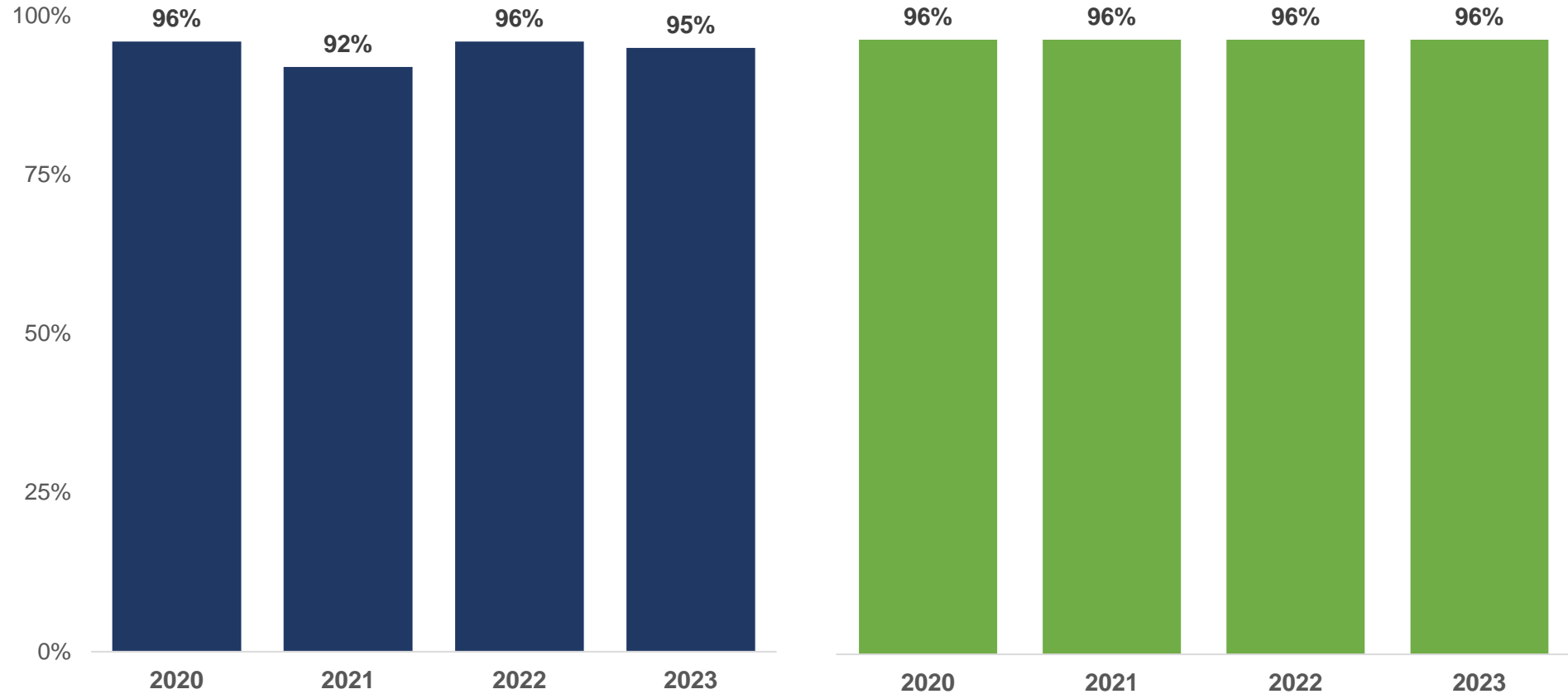
\* 2021 data was excluded because students were for the most part learning remotely.

## *Remains consistent and generally high*

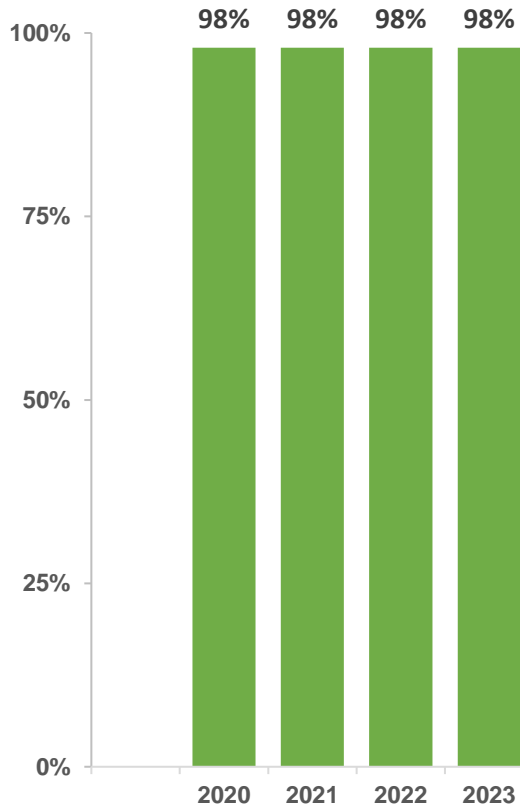
I am satisfied with the education my child has received this year.

# Families of students in Pre-K for All/3-K for All report that they continue to feel supported by their programs

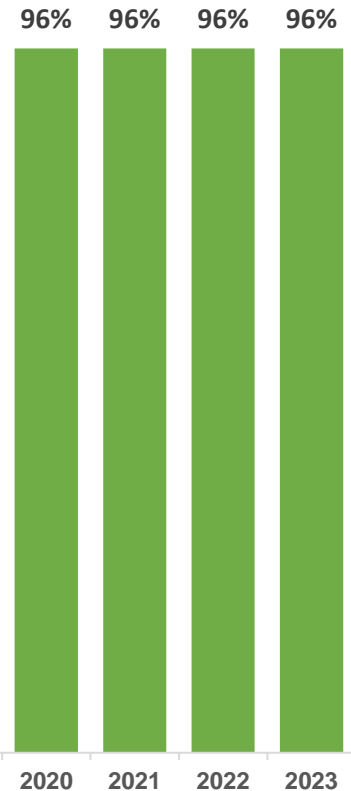
I feel good about the way that my child's teacher helped my child to adjust to their program.



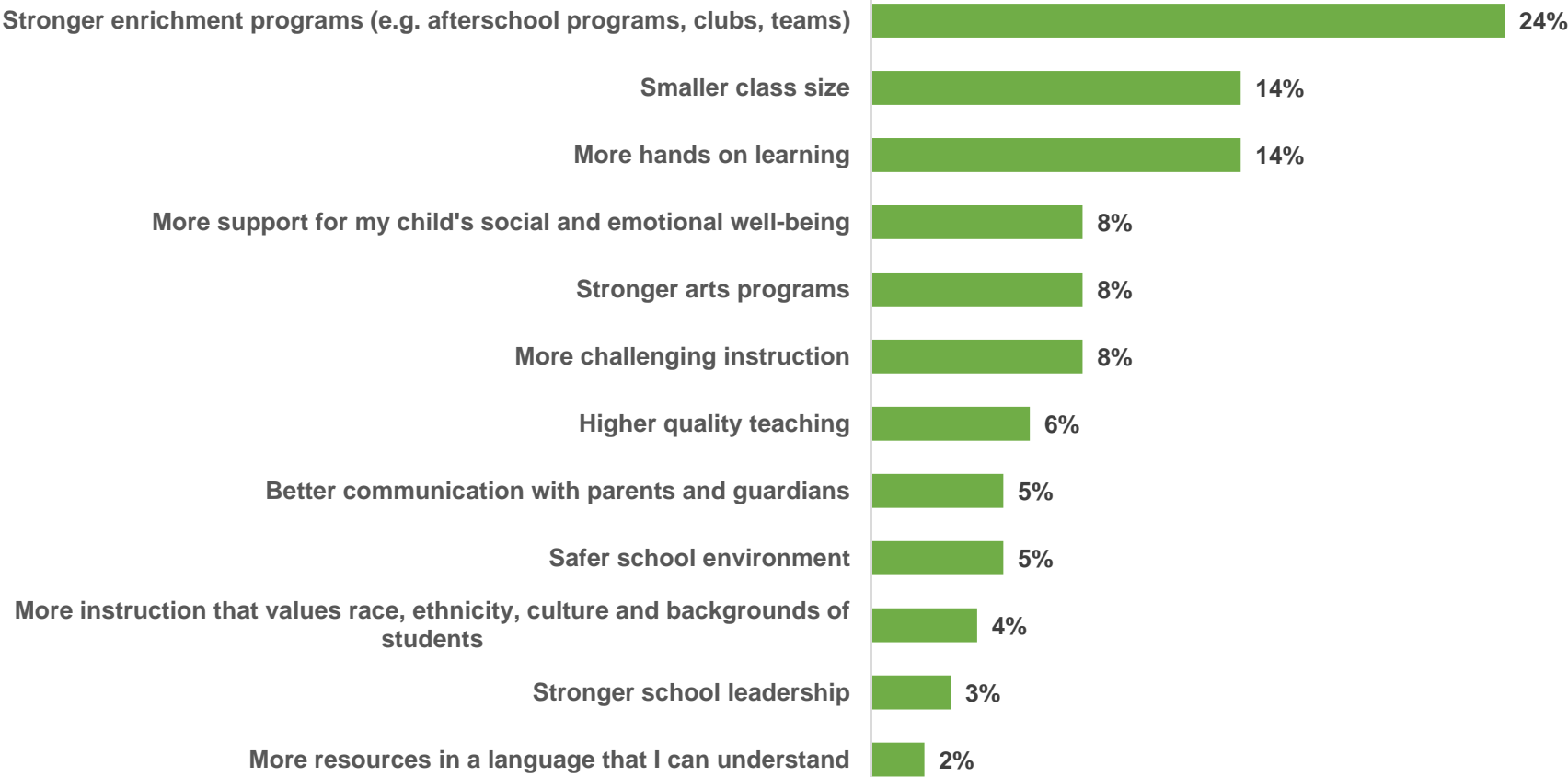
My child's teacher gives me helpful ideas about how I can support my child's learning and development.

My child's race, ethnicity, culture or background is valued at this school.

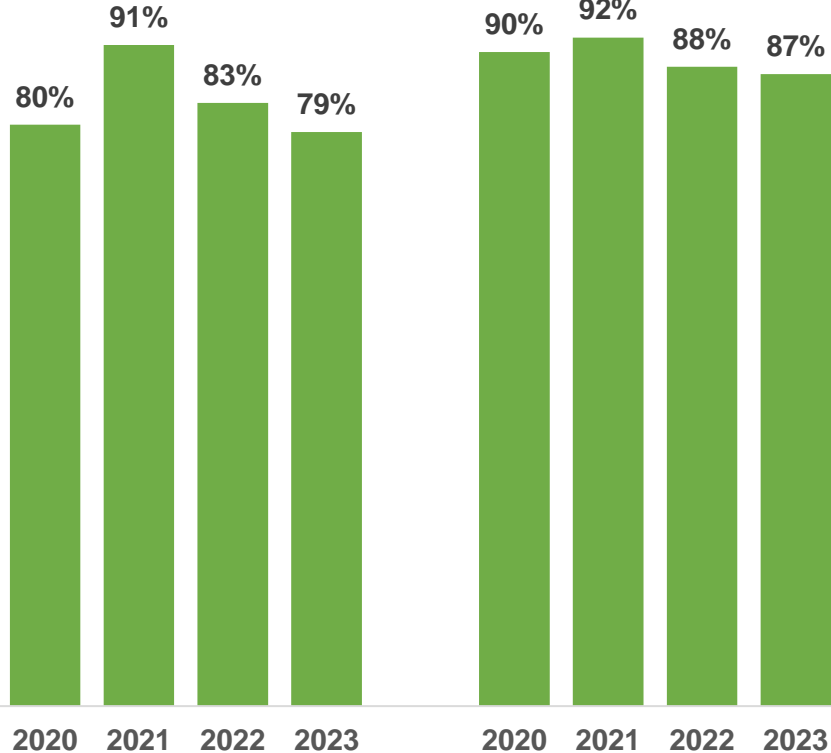
My child feels like they belong at this school.

Most students treat students from different cultures and background equally.

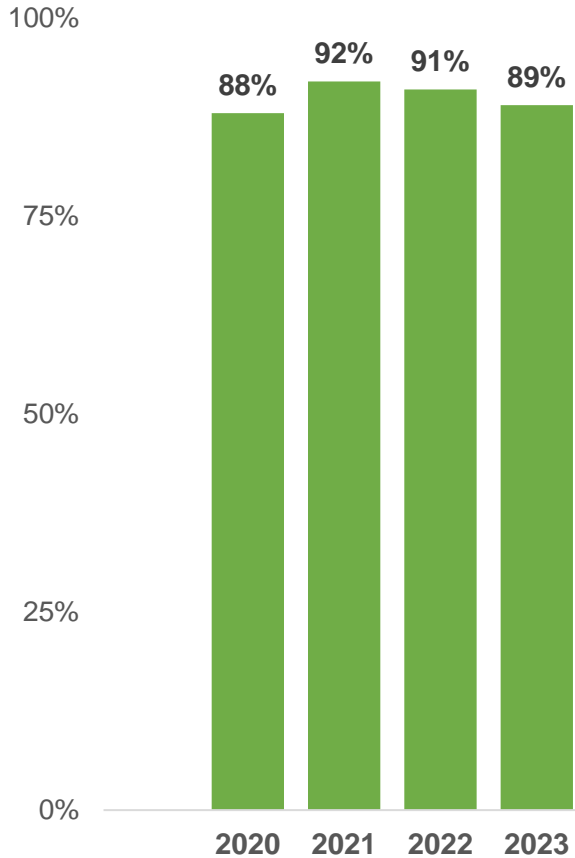
Adults at this school encourage students of all races, ethnicities, genders, cultures, and backgrounds to take challenging classes.





# Teachers continue to report high levels of satisfaction with the learning environment in their schools

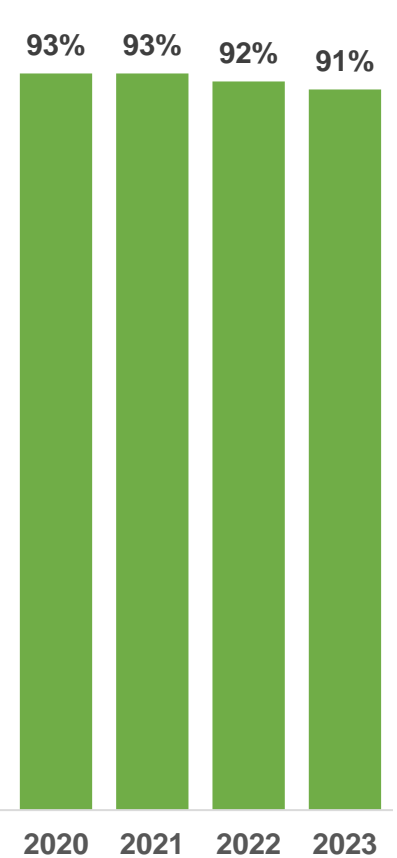
Receive support around how to incorporate students' culture and backgrounds in their practice.



Adults at this school have access to school-based supports to assist in behavioral/emotional escalations.



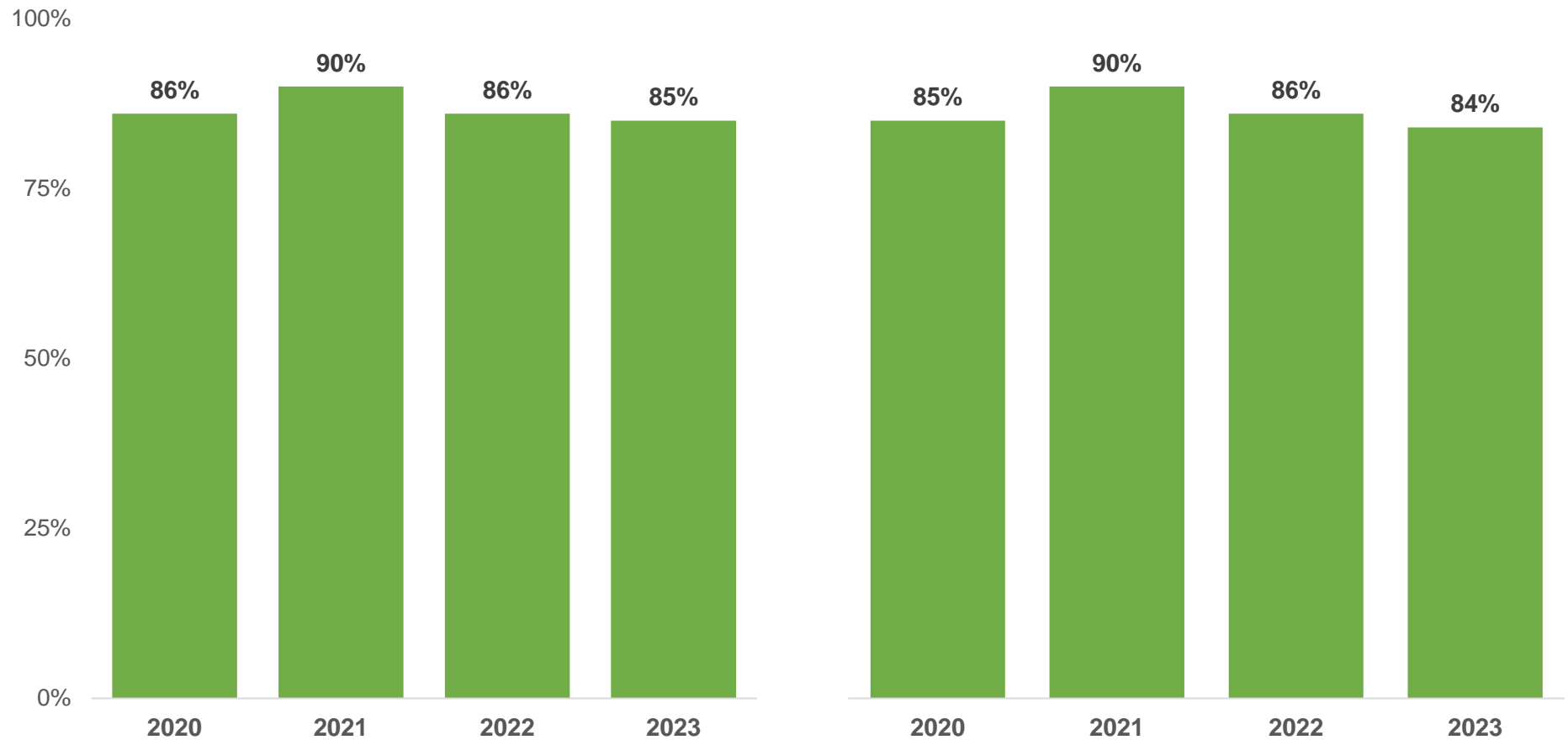
The principal sets high standards for student learning.

I would recommend this school to parents/guardians seeking a place for their child.

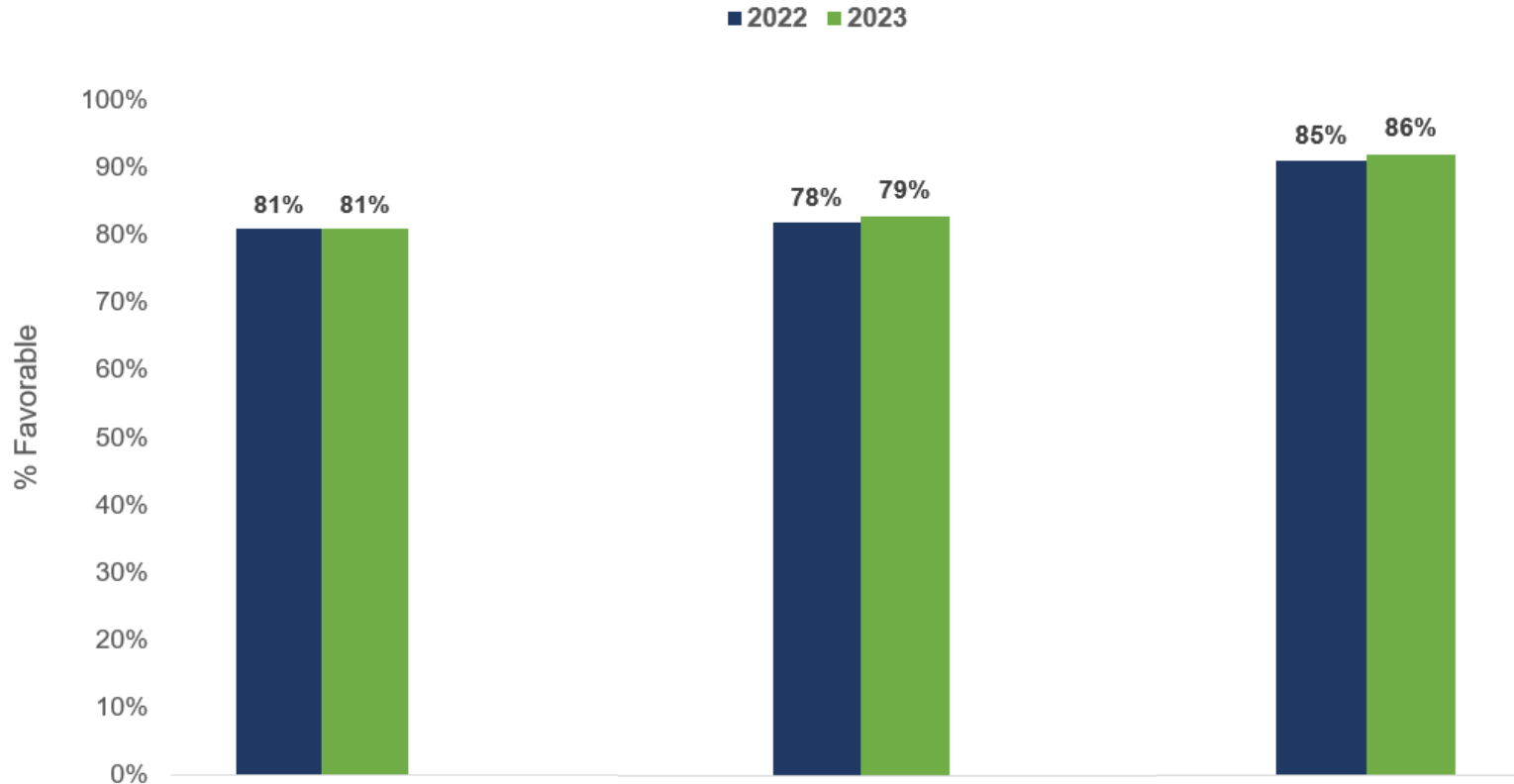


# Teachers are satisfied with the quality of their professional development experiences

Overall, my professional development experiences this year have... included enough time to think carefully about, try, and evaluate new ideas.

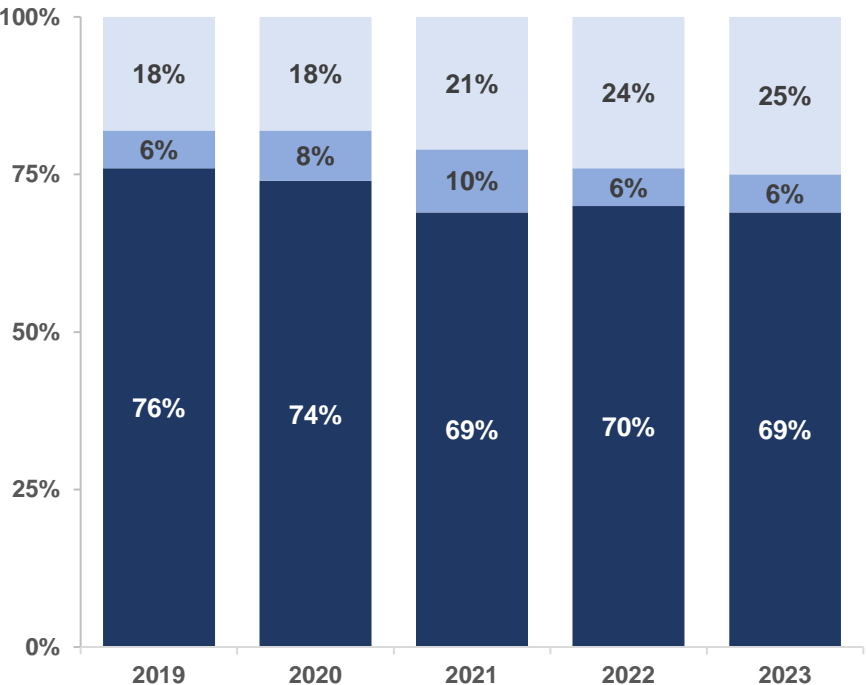
Overall, my professional development experiences this year have... included opportunities to engage in inquiry based, professional collaboration with peers and/or mentors from other schools.

Overall, my professional development experiences this year have... directly related to my students' needs.

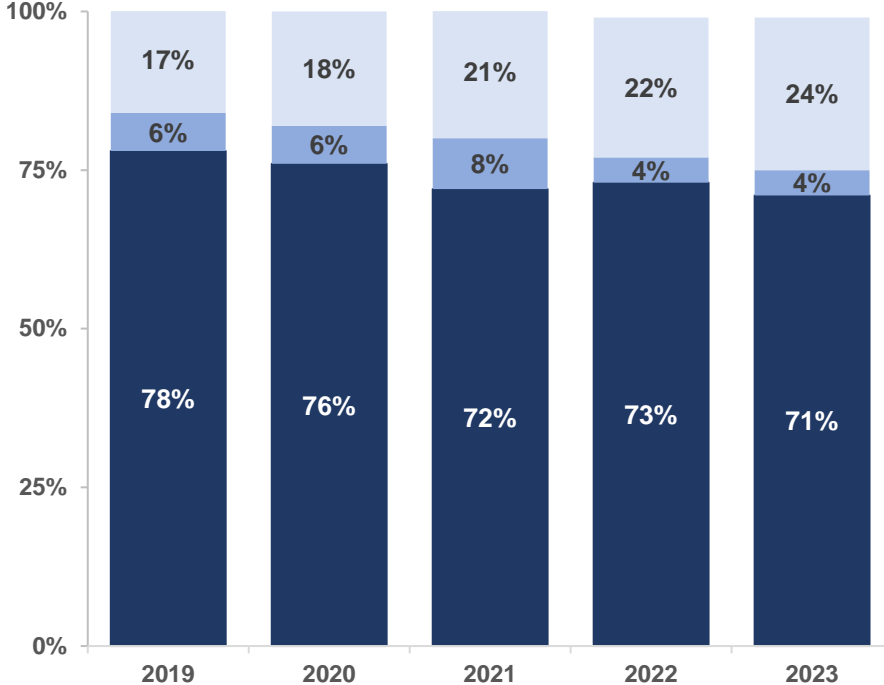

## Satisfaction with the Schools Chancellor



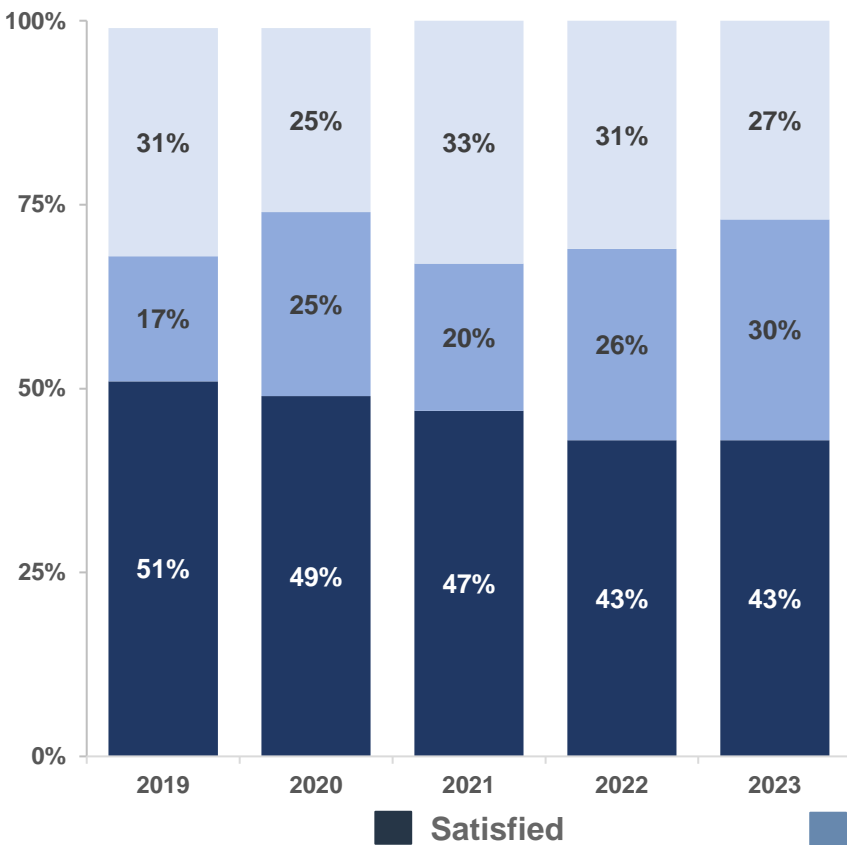

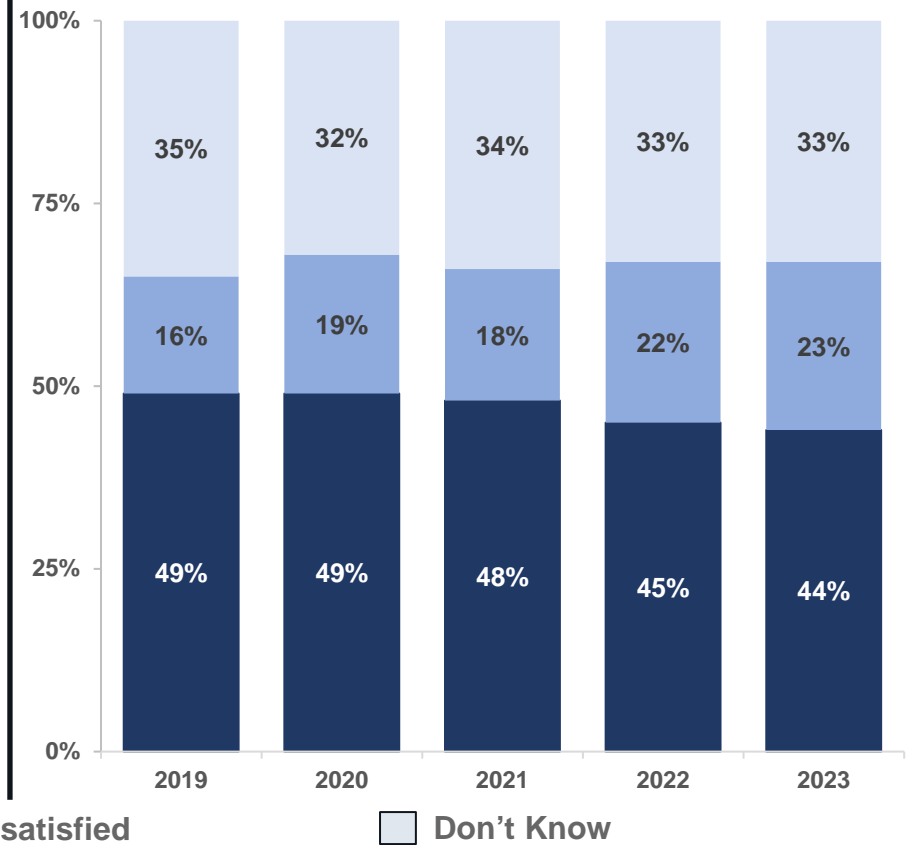
