



New York City Class Size 2024-25 Report (June)

Compliance with New York State's Class Size Caps

Overall, NYC Public Schools is in compliance with the class size law this year. The law requires that 40% of classes are at or below the newly mandated caps in SY 2024-25; this year, 46.5% of classes covered by the law are at or below the caps. More classes are at or below the class size caps both year over year and prior to the pandemic.

Notes: The All Classes category now includes 6-12 Physical Education (PE) and Performing Group (PG) classes, consistent with the law's coverage and requirements. In last year's 11/15/2023 report, the All Classes category excluded PE & PG classes, as NYCPS, UFT and CSA had not yet come to full agreement on these terms. Year/Year changes are calculated based on unrounded figures.

Background on Class Size Calculations


- New York City Public Schools (NYCPS) reports on class size three times a year for City Council in November, February and June. This June report reflects class size data as of 6/15.
 - In both the November and February reports, class data is as of 10/31.
 - NYCPS began reporting June class size data in 2023-24. Data included in this report for years prior to 2023-24 is based on the February report data from those years.
- For grades K-5, average class size is calculated by dividing the number of students as of 6/15 by the number of classes as determined by each student's official class from the Automate the Schools (ATS) system.
- For courses in grades 6-12, average class size is calculated by the number of students as of 6/15 in each course from the STARS system as determined by students who are meeting in the same place at the same time.
- Beginning in 2023-24, to align to the methodology used for the class size law, calculations include bridge classes, non-core courses, including arts and physical education, D75 inclusion students, and shared instruction classes. Now, grades 7-8 are only represented in the STARS scheduling data; grade 6 is included in both depending on the school's scheduling method. These changes resulted in higher average class sizes appearing in the data.

Citywide Class Size Averages

New York City Public Schools (NYCPS) previously reported on class size twice a year with a preliminary report in November and an updated report in February. Results for February reflect refreshed data from 10/31, as the November report includes long-term absences, incomplete scheduling data, and other characteristics that are updated by schools in the February report.

Starting for the 2023-24 school year, NYCPS also reports on class size a third time as of the end of the school year (6/15), reflecting class sizes in the Spring semester.




June average class sizes as of June 15. February average class sizes as of October 31 pulled in February.



Overall class size averages include general education, Integrated Co-Teaching (ICT), G&T and Accelerated classes. 2020-21 class size data is not shown because during remote and blended learning, new guidance was given to schools to assign students to different official classes depending on their blended/remote cohorts. How schools implemented and documented this change varied, therefore 2020-21 class size data may not reflect true class size.

Citywide Class Size Averages by School Type




June average class sizes as of June 15. February average class sizes as of October 31 pulled in February.



Overall class size averages include general education, Integrated Co-Teaching (ICT), G&T and Accelerated classes. The secondary school category includes four K-12 schools. Note that class size comparisons below are made to 2019-20, rather than 2020-21 because during remote and blended learning, new guidance was given to schools to assign students to different official classes depending on their blended/remote cohorts. How schools implemented and documented this change varied, therefore 2020-22 classes data may not reflect true class size.

June 2024-25 Average Class Size by Program Type





ICT stands for Integrated Co-Teaching. Gifted and Talented classes are identified as classes in grades K-5 where students have been placed through NYCDOE's G&T screening process. Middle school accelerated courses are high school credit-bearing courses offered to middle 6 school students. Combined ICT and G&T/Accelerated classes are included as ICT classes.




