A Note to Kindergarten Teachers:

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, sources of information our pre-K teachers typically pass along to kindergarten teachers (such as cumulative record cards and authentic assessment data) are less readily available. Below you will find information from families about their child's pre-K school year. With children spending more time at home with their caregivers over the course of the spring, this document provides families with an opportunity to share with you information about their child, their favorite things about the pre-K year, and their hopes and aspirations for their child for the 2020-21 school year.

Building trusting, productive relationships with families and their children begins with getting to know them. Young children learn in the context of relationships with trusted adults. The answers in this questionnaire are a way to start building those relationships, both with children and families. As we know, families are children's first teachers and the experts on their children; the information they provide can be used alongside other beginning of the year documents at your school, including "getting to know you" surveys, to help you and your teaching team create welcoming, respectful partnerships with families and lay a strong foundation for learning throughout the year.
