Background on Class Size Calculations

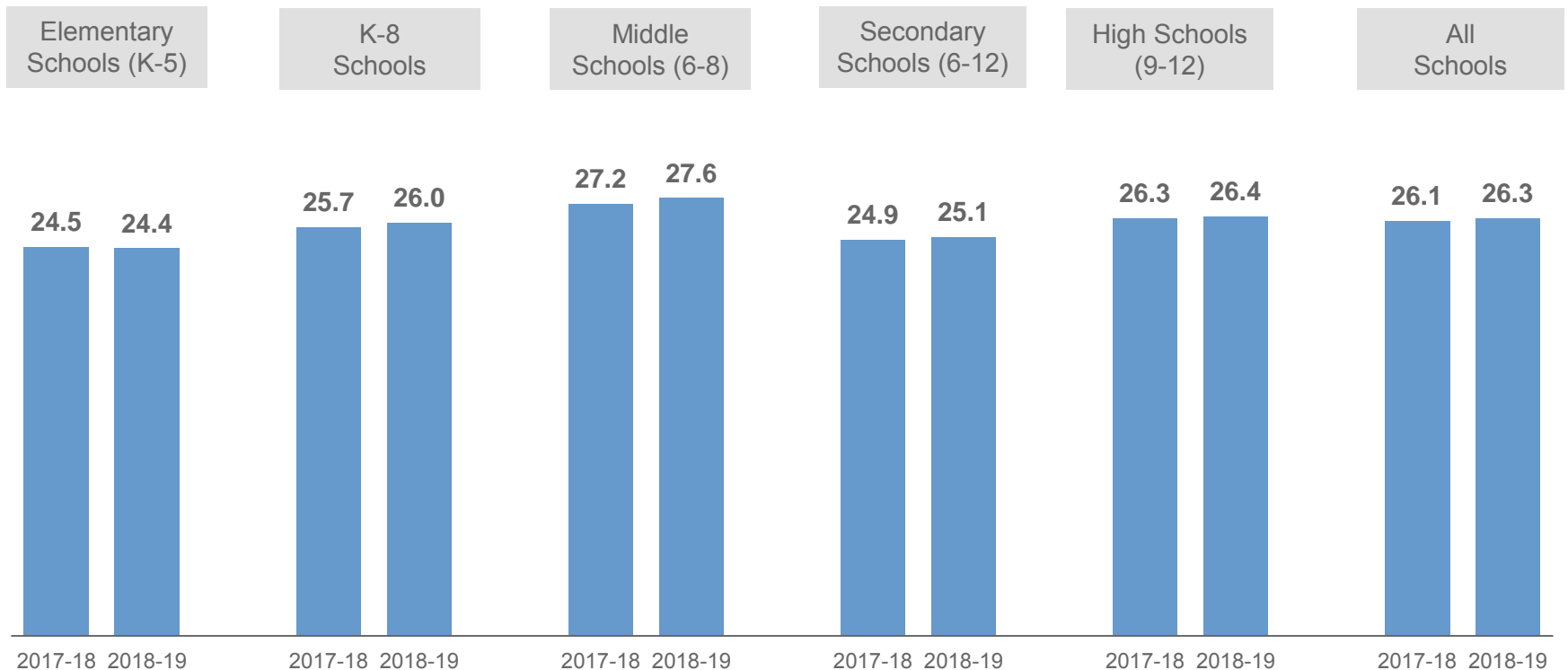
- The New York City Department of Education (NYCDOE) reports on class size twice a year with a preliminary report in November and an updated report in February. This report is the updated report.
- School-level data from ATS and STARS are unaudited. Middle schools and high schools typically update their schedules in STARS through the end of each term. Historically, early data analysis includes long-term absences, incomplete scheduling data, and other characteristics that are updated by schools in the February report.
- For grades K-8, average class size is calculated by dividing the number of students as of October 31st, or “seats filled”, by the number of sections as determined by each student’s official class (e.g. homeroom/advisory) from the Automate the Schools (ATS) system.
- For grades 6-12, average class size is calculated by the average number of students as of October 31st in each section of course courses (English, Math, Science and Social Studies) from the STARS system.

Citywide Class Size Averages by School Type

Updated

Across all grades in 2018-19, the average class size is 26.3 students per class. There was 0.2 increase from 2017-18. (Note: Differences are based on unrounded values.)

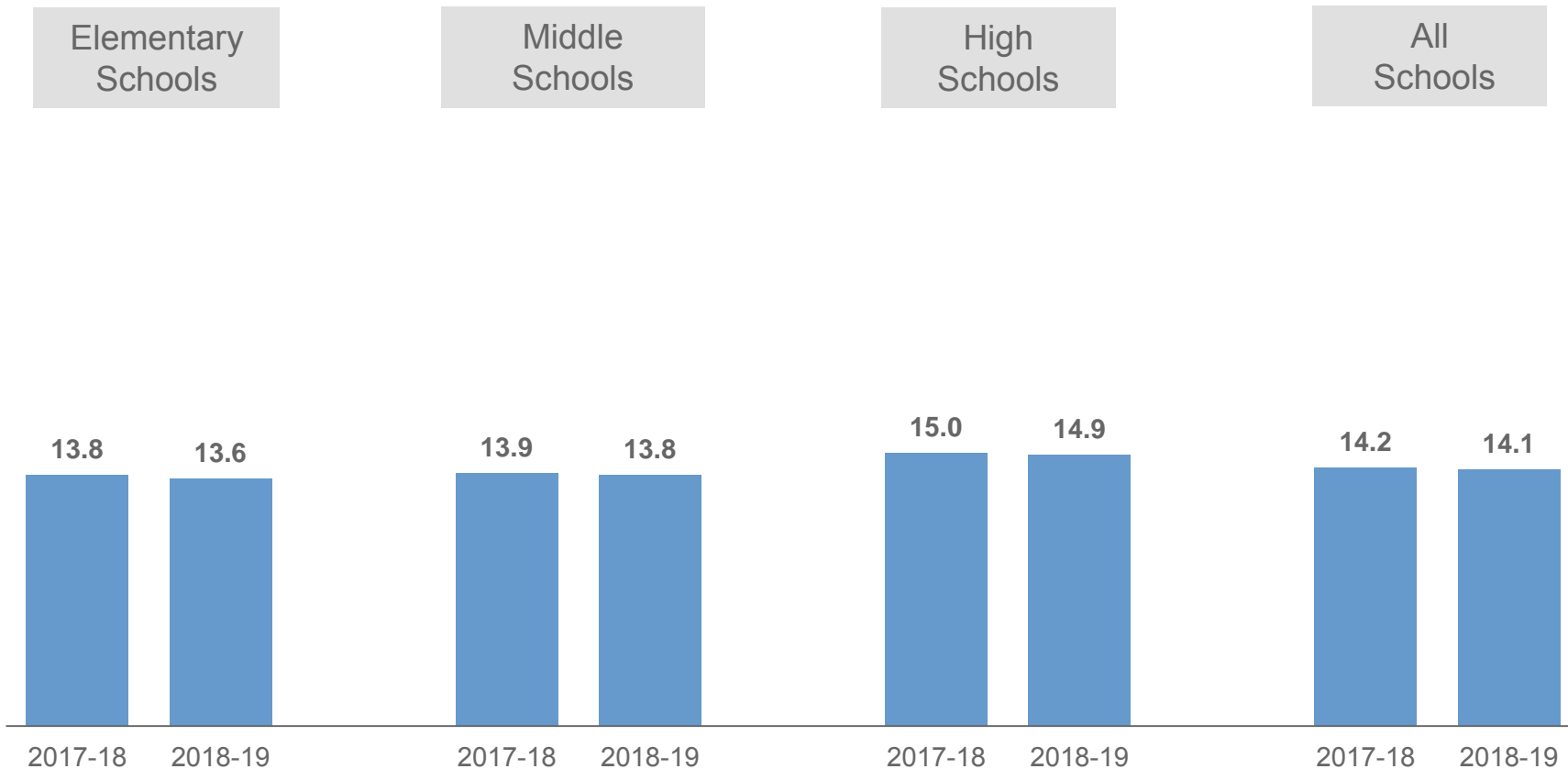
Since 2017-18, 758 schools either decreased or had less than a one percent increase in average class size, while 748 schools increased class size by one or more percent.



Pupil-to-Teacher Ratio by School Type

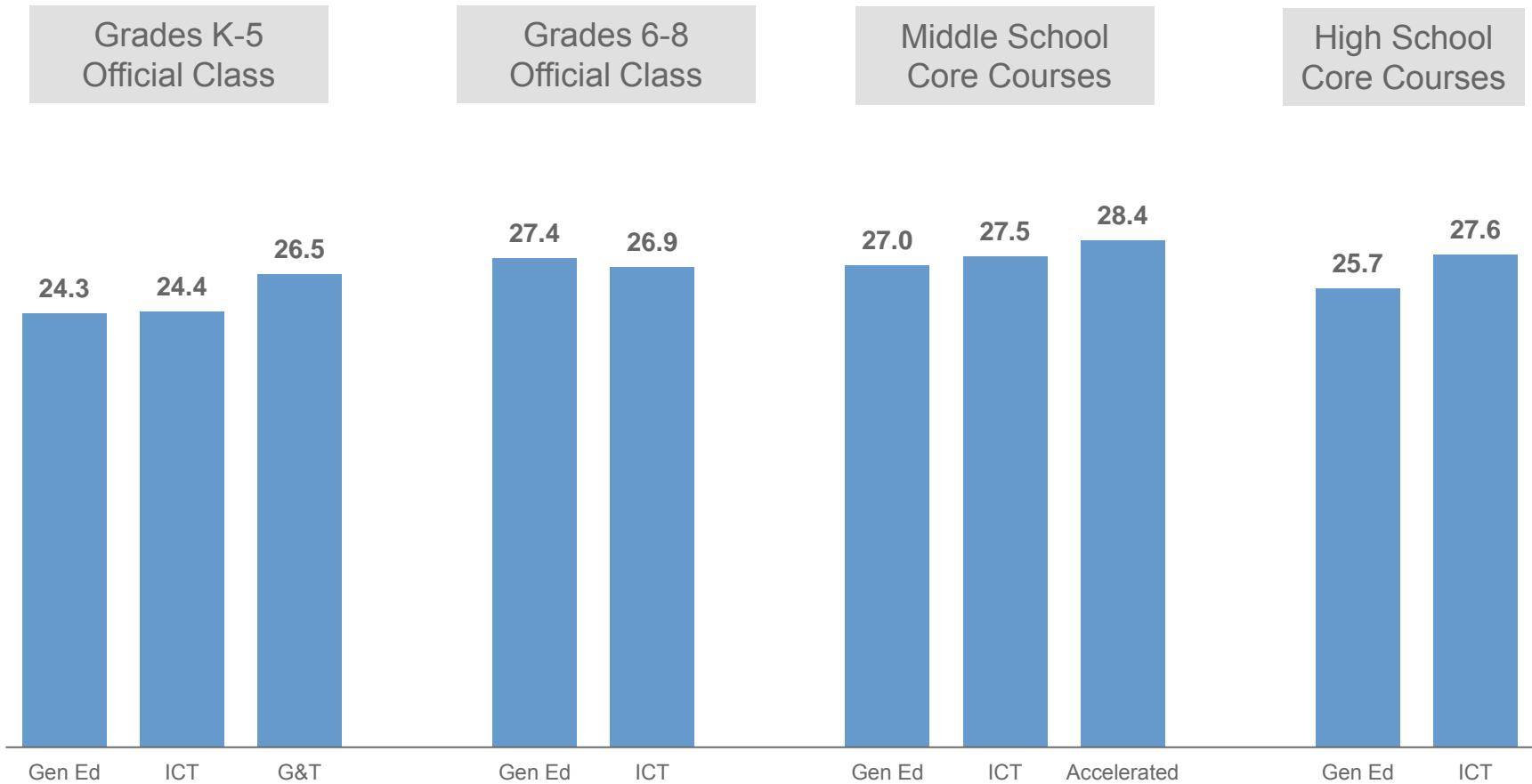
Updated

Across all grades in 2018-19, the PTR was 14.1. There was 0.1 decrease from 2017-18.



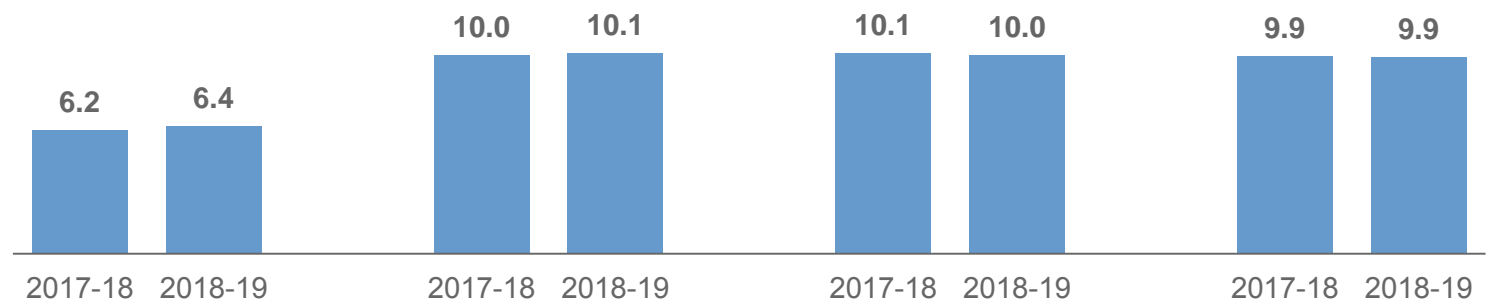
2018-19 Average Class Size by Program Type
