Today New York City Public Schools is releasing a summary of the fall 2025 admissions processes.

This year, improvements to our admissions process have resulted in better outcomes for families:

- For the first time, all 3-K applicants received an offer in May, and more applicants received an offer to their top choice schools than last year.
- A new tool was introduced in MySchools, to show high school applicants their chance of receiving an offer to different programs.
- More high school applicants received an offer to their top choice schools than ever before.
- Families experienced high satisfaction with MySchools, with an average family rating of 4.8 out of 5.
- Across all processes, applicants can now list unlimited choices on their application.

High School Admissions

On March 6^{th,} approximately 72,000 8th graders received a high school offer for fall 2025 admissions, with 59 percent of applicants receiving an offer to their first choice (up from 51 percent last year), and 83 percent receiving an offer to one of their top three choices (up from 77 percent last year). For the third year in a row, offers were in the hands of parents before the independent school deposit deadline.

Chance of Offer

This year a new tool was launched in MySchools that showed each applicant if they have a low, medium, or high chance of getting an offer to high school programs. This gives families more information about the estimated chance of getting an offer to each program of interest, making it easier for them to build a balanced application. 88 percent of respondents to our post-application survey found this tool to be clear and helpful. Most families said they used the tool to find schools that increased their chances of getting an offer from their application, as evidenced by this year's outcomes.

Specialized High Schools

~26,000 8th graders took the SHSAT this year, and ~4,000 received an offer to a testing Specialized High School based on their exam score.

An additional ~800 students were approved to participate in the Discovery program, which provides opportunities for disadvantaged students who scored within a certain range on the Specialized High Schools Admissions Test (SHSAT) to attend a testing Specialized High School.

We are proud to continue to expand access to accelerated education and rigorous coursework for students across the city, with cohorts of students joining the inaugural class at HBCU (Historically Black College & University) Early College Prep High School, and a new class of students joining the below accelerated high schools:

On April 9, approximately 59,000 5th graders received a middle school offer for fall 2025 admissions. A similar percentage of applicants received an offer to their top choices as last year.

Kindergarten Admissions

On April 2, approximately 47,000 children received a kindergarten offer, including ~1,500 offers for Gifted and Talented programs.

For families that submitted applications:

- 83 percent of applicants received an offer to their first program choice, up from 81 last year.
- 98 percent of applicants received an offer to any choice on their application, up from 97 last year.

Pre-K Admissions

On May 13th, approximately 55,600 children received a pre-K offer for fall 2025 admissions. 80 percent of applicants received an offer to their first program choice.

93 percent of applicants are receiving an offer to any choice on their application, down from 96 percent last year. The remaining 7 percent of students did not receive an offer to an application choice but are on the waitlist for all programs on their application.

3K Admissions

On May 20, approximately 44,000 children received a 3K offer for fall 2025 admissions. Demand for 3K has risen over 200 percent since 2019, and for the first time this year all applicants received an offer.

Note: Some offers counted above are to toddlers enrolled in childcare seats that did not submit applications. This is to ensure continuity of services. Additional offers are also made to children in low-demand neighborhoods that started applications but never submitted to ensure providers have the best chance of filling seats.

Summer Rising

On April 9, approximately 114,000 students received a Summer Rising offer for summer 2025 admissions.

- A total of ~154K applications were submitted this year, up ~15,000 from last year.
- ~114K/74 percent of applicants are receiving an offer to an application choice, compared to ~110K/79 percent last year and ~94K/68% for summer 2023. Of students who received an offer,
 - o 83 percent are receiving an offer to their first choice, same as last year.
 - 97 percent are receiving an offer to one of their top three choices, same as last year.
